

# ~ President's Message ~

# To all of our FCOC friends,



This year, we have experienced some significant changes in our club and to our membership. We have a couple of programs in the works to benefit the membership, but the important event is the loss of three of our most valued members to business ventures that have required more and more of their time. The departure of these individuals, who are also friends, is difficult especially when they have made significant contributions over the years to the growth of our club and their departure deprives us of their continued experience in dealing with the details and problems associated with managing a club as large as FCOC.

I speak first of Ginny and Chuck Belba. Chuck and Ginny have been members of the club since the club was formed. Ginny was the Club Secretary until December 2004, and Chair of our Nominating Committee. Chuck was nominated to be our first Vice President, Membership at the April 2001 Business Meeting and confirmed at the October 2001 meeting in Hutchinson, KS. He filled that job continuously until he decided not to run for office again and submitted his resignation in August following the Greenfield Business Meeting. The other noteworthy individual is Tom James. Tom replaced Pete Palasota on 1 January 2006 and served as our Club Treasurer until his resignation in August. Managing the finances of our club is almost more than a full time job. Tom was the single source within FCOC for receipt, distribution and accounting of funds from multiple sources, paying all bills, being audited on an annual basis, and then submitting accurate tax returns to a state and the IRS. Tom quietly did his job with exceptional care and always made sure that our funds were handled in a proper manner.

The two programs I **briefly** mentioned **above** are "PayPal" which will enable our membership to renew their membership electronically, and to purchase certain items available only to club members. We are working on implementing PayPal and will provide more information as it becomes available. The other program is one that we, and specifically Tom James, have been working on for a number of years. Jonathan Randall announced at the Greenfield Business Meeting a new program launched on Monday, July 27<sup>th</sup>, the Oasis Discount Dealer Program, where our members will receive a discount on parts and service. Right now, we have 13 Oasis Dealers and hope to have more soon. You will find the list of the participating 13 Oasis Dealers elsewhere in this newsletter, together with some other sponsors on pages 6 and 23 that are actively supporting our club. Please remember them all, as they deserve our business.

There were some items raised during the Executive Board Meeting following the FCOC National Rally at the S&H Campground, that will require changes to both our Bylaws and Standing Rules, and are located elsewhere in this newsletter. There was also much discussion during this meeting regarding the decision to relocate the semi-annual business meeting from the FMCA International Convention to the FCOC National Rally following the FMCA. The initial decision was made based upon comments submitted by the membership in response to the FCOC Membership Rally Questionnaire contained in the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2008 Freightliner Flyer. The Executive Board determined that we should continue having the Business Meeting during the FCOC National Rallies for the year 2010 (Amarillo and River Bend). After that, the program will be reviewed to determine if the Business Meeting should be returned to the location of the FMCA International Convention.

Last but certainly not least, I would like to thank all of you for having faith in my plans for the future of our club, and electing me as President at the FCOC National Rally, S&H Campground, Greenfield, IN.

# FMCA CORNER

Governing Board Meeting, Bowling Green, Ohio July 20, 2009



The meeting opened at 9 a.m., and the attendance was taken. Four hundred sixteen out of 501 National Directors, Alternate National Directors and temporary delegates were seated. FMCA President Connie Pool gave the official coach count for the Bowling Green Bash which was 2,725 coaches. That figure included 2,426 family member coaches and 299 commercial coaches. Throughout the long day, some eleven and one-half hours, many items were discussed. I will try to highlight them for you.

The budget was the biggest item. Treasurer Doug Key reported that FMCA investments had gained \$768,000 in the second quarter but our year-to-date net loss after investments is \$907,000. The year-to-date net loss from operations is \$497,000 based on absence of revenue. Doug estimates the loss for 2009 will be \$1,600,000. Doug indicated that after labor costs and magazine printing/distribution, MEDEX is the most expensive program FMCA has representing an annual expense of \$519,000 for 2008 and 2009. He presented the proposed 2010 budget which had been previously approved by the FMCA Executive Board, eliminating the MEDEX program. After much discussion the Governing Board passed an amendment that FMCA fund the MEDEX program for 2010 per the two-year contract out of cash reserves.

The mail forwarding service will increase from \$5 to \$10 per month per user. The International Convention family coach registration fee will be increased by \$15. There will be an increase for registration through the national office for Area Rallies from \$1 to \$3 per family coach. The road atlas for new members will be discontinued for 2010. Educational programs-CPR/AED, Safe Driving, and coach weighing will be discontinued at Area Rallies. All magazine advertising sales have been brought in-house. The travel budget was reduced to the IRS auto rate for the Executive Board and staff. Travel and living expenses were reduced for the President and national officers by 50% for 2009 and 2010. The staff in Cincinnati was decreased, salaries reduced by 10% and the 401K company match was discontinued 3-1-2009. With all of these actions, the approved 2010 budget will result in a nearly \$800,000 deficit budget.

A motion was passed that "in each fiscal year, a Chapter shall hold at least one business meeting at which a quorum is present. Said meeting shall be duly announced in advance to the membership."

A Life Membership was given to Max and Joanne Durbin for their many years of service to FMCA. Joanne is our present FMCA National Secretary.

Our newly elected FMCA national officers are: President-Charlie Schrenkel, Sr. Vice President-Judy Czarsty, Secretary-Joanne Durbin, and Treasurer-Wilburn Young.

# Minutes of Freightliner Chassis Owners Club Business Meeting Greenfield, Indiana – July 26, 2009

President Ron Sliger called the meeting to order at 4:10p.m. There were approximately 105 members in attendance. President Sliger asked Ken Hawk to give the invocation. Ken also asked for a moment of silence for member Ted Ford, who passed away unexpectedly at the FMCA at Bowling Green. President Sliger led the membership in the Pledge of Allegiance.

All First time attendees, Veterans, Rally Master, Assistant Rally Masters and Volunteers were asked to stand and be recognized.

President Sliger introduced the Officers present, Senior Vice President - Steve Batorson, Secretary -Barbara Knutson, Treasurer - Tom James/Rick Kennedy, Vice President Webmaster - Rick Kennedy, Vice President Area Operations West - Katherine Henley, National Director - Roy Hopper and Alternate National Director - Mary Costigan. He also, introduced our new Parliamentarian- Joe Costigan. Jonathan Randall, Director of Sales & Marketing, FCCC., talked about how the Company is doing. Things have slowed down, in the RV business, but the School Bus work is keeping them going. They are still in the black. He also talked about the new Electric Chassis that President Obama's people will be trying out. He also told us about the new program to launch on Monday, July 27th, the Oasis Discount Dealer program where we will get a discount on parts and service. Right now we have 13 Oasis Dealers and hope to have more soon. The Freightliner people that were at the rally were, Jonathan Randall, Scott Lucas, Joe Patterson, Tommy and Pat Smith, Bob and Becky Mango, Rommy Campbell and Dean Brazo. President Sliger, introduced Sonny Gillespie, FMCA Vice President of the International Area and his wife Carol. Sonny talked about the International Rally that will be held January 20-24, 2010 at Quartzsite, Arizona He talked about the new Officers for FMCA. President Sliger, introduced Col. Mark Hughes, Wing Commander, Indiana Civil Air Patrol. Col. Hughes will be available for questions after the meeting. President Sliger then made a Motion that Roberts Rules be suspended for the rest of the meeting. The motion was seconded. Discussion followed and the motion was voted down, so the meeting was run with Roberts Rules. To make the meeting run smoother President Sliger asked the members to please wait to be recognized before speaking and please state your name when making a motion.

Minutes of the Perry, Georgia meeting was published in the Second Quarter Newsletter. President Sliger asked that the reading of the minutes be waived. A motion was made and seconded, there being no further discussion and no corrections that the minutes are accepted as published.

Tom James the outgoing Treasurer read the report on the Lazy Days Rally. The report will be included with the minutes. The report was accepted as written. We did have a Net Gain of \$1,076.62. We had 140 coaches in attendance. Ron thanked Tom for all his hard work, during his tenure as treasurer. A Motion was made by Ed Shinkle and seconded by Dave Barr to accept the Lazy Days Report from the Treasurer.

Steve Batorson gave his report on Article V - Chapter Officer Travel Expenses. Some members had concerns as to whether the meeting we had in August of 2006 was a legal meeting. Steve, talked with many members and got conflicting answers, so he went outside of the club to get an answer. He contacted two Congresswomen, one currently serving and one retired and both expert and experienced parliamentarians to review the issues concerning the Business Meeting held in August 2006 and the following of Roberts Rules. As Chairperson of the Review Committee, with the information from the experts reviewing the documentation, Senior Vice President Steve Batorson recommended that the membership accept Article V as written and include Article V in the approved Standing Rules of the club. A motion from Steve Batorson was made to accept Article V of the Standing Rules - Reimbursement of Club Officers. This was a committee recommendation and no need for a second. Discussion followed and the motion was accepted.

Vice President Area Operations-West, Katherine Henley, said she is hoping to hold a Rally before the FMCA Rally for the Rocky Mountain Area. Information will be published on the web and E-blast will be going out. Looking for people to be Rally Master in the West Area. Tom James, is trying to put a Rally together for California. Katherine will work with anyone who is willing to do a Rally. She explained that the Rally Master does not pay for the Rally.

Rick Kennedy, Vice President Webmaster said that about 700 e-mails were returned, from a recent mailing to all FCOC members, indicating we need to update our e-mail addresses. Anyone who wishes to give Rick a new/current e-mail address can contact him at

Roy Hopper, National Director gave the official coach count at Bowling Green Bash as 2,426 family coaches and 299 commercial coaches. Treasurer Doug Key, indicated that FMCA suffered a major loss of over \$3.1 million dollars in 2008 and for 2009 we are facing a projected loss of \$1.6 million. This is due to a loss of 21% of membership since 2004, and rally attendance being down etc. New FMCA National Officers were elected at Bowling Green, Ohio - President -Charlie Schrenkel, Senior Vice President - Judy Czarsty, Secretary -Joanne Durbin and Treasurer - William Young. Area vice Presidents are Midwest Area - Al Talbott, Northeast Area - Paul DuBois, -Rocky Mountain Area - Allen Rein,- South Central Area - Fred Kennedy and Southeast Area - Tom Eller. A motion was passed in FMCA that in each fiscal year a Chapter shall hold at least one business meeting at which a quorum is present. Meeting shall be duly announced in advance. FMCA did not want to renew the contract for MEDEX, but it was voted down.

Vice President Communication Steve Batorson talked about newsletters coming back and how much it cost us. You can go on to the website and get your newsletter downloaded. It will save us money and you get it earlier. We will be having a post rally after the Albuquerque FMCA rally in Amarillo, Texas at the Oasis Rv Resort. All sights have concrete pads and 50amp service. There are no trees, but we will water down twice a day to keep the dust down. We can hold 95 coaches, so get your reservation in early. Steve and Kim Batorson are Rally Masters and Barb and Lee Knutson are Assistant Rally Masters. In August we will be going to the River Bend Resort in Harrisburg, Or. Steve gave the results of the survey and they are published in the second Quarter. The Nominating Chairperson Gerry DeHeer was not able to attend the Rally so Barbara Knutson, member of the committee read the report. The report was also in the Second Quarter newsletter. The Nominating Committee submitted the following slate of officers. President - Ron Sliger, Vice President Membership - Mary Costigan, Vice President. Webmaster - Rick Kennedy, Vice President Area Operations - West - Katherine Henley, Alternate National Director - Joe Costigan and Secretary - Barbara Knutson. There were no nominations for any of the positions from the floor. Motion was made by Dave Barr and seconded by Lois Knuth to accept the slate of officers as presented. The motion passed.


We need three members to do our audit. Please see Rick Kennedy after the meeting if you wish to help with the Audit.

# Answers from RVIA: Split Model Years

The Recreation Vehicle Industry Association (RVIA) has recently published a document entitled "Q & A's on Split Model Years for Motorhomes." As the title infers, it relates to questions that can arise regarding the chassis manufacturer's model year and the model year assigned to the completed motor home by the final stage motor home manufacturer. Below is the original memo from the RVIA for your reference and information.



# Q & A's on Split Model Years for Motorhomes

*How is the manufacturing of motorhomes different from cars?* Motorhomes are "multi-stage vehicles." This means that, unlike cars, they generally are built in two separate stages by two different manufacturers.

*How is motorhome manufacturing divided into different stages?* The first-stage manufacturer, also called the "incomplete vehicle manufacturer," assembles the motorhome chassis. This typically includes such components as the chassis frame, engine, fuel system, transmission, drive train, suspension, wheels, brakes and vehicular electrical system. These "incomplete vehicles" are then sold by the chassis manufacturer to final stage motorhome manufacturers, also called "completed vehicle manufacturers." The motorhome manufacturers take the chassis and build the coach body, all of the "household" systems, install the appliances, cabinets, furnishings, plumbing, lighting fixtures and a multitude of various amenities, resulting in a completed vehicle.

*How do first stage manufacturers identify their vehicles?* According to federal law, 'at 49 *CFR* 565. *13(a)*, a vehicle manufactured in more than one stage must have a Vehicle Identification Number ("VIN") assigned to it by the incomplete vehicle manufacturer. One character position in the VIN sequence identifies the model year of the incomplete vehicle. Once it is assigned, this VIN stays with the incomplete vehicle when it is sold to the motorhome manufacturer. The incomplete vehicle manufacturer may also ship the chassis with a "Manufacturer's Certificate of Origin ("MCO"). This MCO document provides information about each particular chassis.

# How do final stage manufactures identify their vehicles?

Final stage motorhome manufacturers continue to use the VIN assigned by the incomplete vehicle manufacturer. Motorhome manufacturers also provide MCO documents with their motorhomes when they are shipped to dealers. The model year of the completed motorhome, which is determined by the motorhome manufacturer, appears on this MCO document.

# Why do some chassis have a different model year than the completed motorhome?

An incomplete vehicle chassis is manufactured before a completed motorhome is built on it. Motorhome manufacturers may buy hundreds, even thousands, of chassis each year. Because of variations in advance purchases of incomplete vehicle chassis, the flow of new product orders, market conditions and new model roll-outs, the model year of the incomplete vehicle chassis is frequently different from the model year of the completed motorhome. # Q & A's on Split Model Years for Motorhomes (continued)

# What are some examples of model year difference?

A group of fifty chassis could be built at the end of a calendar year and assigned that year's model year by the incomplete vehicle manufacturer. A few weeks later, those chassis could be sold to a motorhome manufacturer. The motorhome manufacturer may use half of them to finish production of one motorhome make, assigning those motorhomes the motorhome manufacturer's current model year on their final MCO's. These completed motorhomes would have a model year one year greater than the model year of the chassis. The motorhome manufacturer may later use the other half of the chassis in manufacturing a new motorhome design, assigning those motorhomes the <u>next</u> model year. As a result, their final MCO's would have a model year designation that is two years greater than the chassis model year. In another. example, a chassis manufacturer may decide to skip a model year entirely and designate its chassis one year ahead of the then current calendar year. This could result in motorhomes having a model year one year less than the chassis model year.

# Who decides what the "official" model year of the vehicle is?

The final stage motorhome manufacturer has authority to designate on the completed vehicle MCO the model year of the completed motorhome. <u>See Federal Trade Commission Staff Opinion (March 5,2001)</u>.

# Is it permissible to have different model years for the chassis and completed motorhome?

Yes, it is permissible. The United States Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") has directly addressed this very issue and determined in a formal staff opinion that it is NOT an unfair or deceptive trade practice for the completed motorhome and its chassis to have different model years. **In** recognition of the fact that the final stage motorhome manufacturer has the authority to designate the model year for motorhomes, the FTC has stated that the incomplete vehicle chassis manufacturer may use the phrase, "Model Year - Not Applicable" on the MCO's for the incomplete vehicles it sends to final stage motorhome manufacturers, if it so chooses. *See Federal Trade Commission Staff Opinion (March* 5, 2001).

# Is the motorhome manufacturer required to disclose the difference between the model year of the incomplete vehicle and the model year of the incomplete chassis?

No. However, four states (California, Maryland, Michigan and Wisconsin) require dealers to inform purchasers of multi-stage vehicles of the difference between the model year of the incomplete vehicle chassis and the model year of the final stage motorhome.

# What information is used by state DMV offices to register motorhomes?

When a consumer has a new motorhome registered for the first time, the state DMV will use both the VIN assigned by the incomplete vehicle manufacturer and the model year and make assigned by the final stage motorhome manufacturer for the vehicle registration. All states should title motorhomes using the model year assigned by the final stage motorhome manufacturer.

# What should I do if a state DMV registers a new motorhome with the chassis model

*year*? If a DMV employee insists on using the incomplete chassis model year, please call the Recreation Vehicle Industry Association at 703-620-6003 for assistance. Ask for the Government Affairs Department.





The lifestyle also offers the freedom to pick up and go whenever and wherever a person wants.

# Storage of Service Parts

FCCC believes it's a good idea for RV owners to carry essential spare parts with them during their travels. Carrying spare parts ensures you will have the correct filters or belts when getting your coach serviced, and also assists during emergency situations such as water in the fuel, a belt breakage, etc. Vacation time is precious and having a spare part could possibly help salvage an otherwise doomed trip.

Here is a list of spare parts that FCCC suggests carrying with you in your RV:

- 1. Fuel filter
- 2. Fuel water separator
- 3. Serpentine belt
- 4. V-belt (Caterpillar engines) for the water pump belt
- 5. V-belt (Cummins pre-EGR engines) for the air conditioner belt

Knowing which parts to carry is important, but knowing how to store them is essential. All parts have a shelf life and protecting them from contaminants will extend the life of the part for months, or even years. One way to do this is by using vacuum-sealing machines. These range in price from \$50 to \$100 and are available at most retail outlets. Vacuum sealing your new parts in plastic will pull the air out, keeping them free of moisture and dirt.

If you do not have a vacuum sealing machine, they sell a Ziploc® system and space saver bags you can put items in and use your vacuum cleaner hose to seal. This does not pull as strong as vacuum-sealing machines and sometimes the seal is tricky to complete, but it still pulls most of the air out of the bag.

As most filters have a metal screen inside, vacuum sealing will prevent the metal from rusting. Belts can also be preserved in this manner. Sealing the belt in a vacuum bag can extend the life of the belt for up to 10 years. The sealed bag will keep air, moisture and ozone out, significantly reducing the possibility of deterioration. Another way to increase the life of your spare parts is to protect them from exposure to heat, extreme cold or open flame.

One helpful hint is to cut the plastic sealing bag a little longer than you need the first time around so you can keep resealing the same bag every time you replace the part.

Storage space could be an issue you may face when carrying spare parts in your RV. Here are a few suggestions of potential storage areas:

- 1. Under the fold-away table cabinets
- 2. In the back of a closet, or even hanging from a hanger by clips
- 3. Under the kitchen sink
- 4. The bottom of a drawer and lay clothes or blankets on top

If you are still concerned about the parts going bad, simply rotate them out at every service. This will ensure that if you do need them in an emergency, they are just as reliable as if you just purchased them from a dealer.


Brenda Sliger went into the hospital for hip replacement the week of Sept 14<sup>th</sup>.
