I was able to call the Cat dealer - who informed me they could not do anything on a weekend - however; they did give me some other options that helped me to find the services I needed. I can tell you first hand that panic sets in when you run into trouble on the road, and the less you have to worry about as far as phone numbers and getting help goes, the better, and this is the very best solution.

Now to further help yourself, you should have your last six digits of your VIN ID written down, along with engine manufacturer, model number and HP. I would also have this information noted in more than one place. I now have it on the back on my membership card for the club, on my road service card and with my registration and insurance documents that I carry as well. Even though I hope to never need it again, I'm glad I am now properly prepared.

- GREEN POINT CAMPGROUND Located in Pacific Rim National Park, B.C., it's the only campground along the 22 kilometers of Long Beach. Perched on a hill above the beach, the site allows for deep relaxation, beach exploration and surfing - and a 20-minute drive leads to excellent Grey whale watching from the Amphitrite Lighthouse.
- POLSON MOTORCOACH & RV RESORT Although its home in Montana may throw you for a loop, the Class A RV resort offers exclusive oversized lots and luxurious amenities, such as an onsite gym and heated pool, but that's not all. The resort's surroundings - Flathead Lake's deep blue water and Mission Mountains' snow-capped peaks in the distance, as well as Glacier National Park just a few miles away are what earned Polson a spot on our list.
- LAKE OF THE WOODS CAMPGROUND A somewhat far cry from the luxury resort above, it takes a 3) day of hiking to reach this campground of the Cathedral Provincial Park, B.C. in the Cascade Mountains. Its most famous hike, Cathedral Rim Trail, takes you along its fish-filled lakes and granite walls, and passes renown geological formations: Smokey the Bear, Devil's Woodpile and Stone City. A shuttle is available if you don't feel like hiking, but it's definitely worth the work!
- HUNTING ISLAND STATE PARK South Carolina is known for its beautiful wildlife, but this former 4) hunting preserve's beaches and natural beauty are beyond compare. The marsh boardwalk, rustic nature trails, fishing pier and historic lighthouse make for some of the most breath-taking views you'll ever see.
- CRYSTAL COVE STATE PARK California may mean "expensive" or "luxurious" in your mind, but Crystal Cove sharply contrasts its surroundings - fresh-laid green golf courses and million-dollar homes. Looking out over the Pacific Ocean, its 58 campsites (of which only 27 offer water and electric hook-ups) really allow one to reconnect with nature. The tide pools, sandy coves, underwater park and access to El Moro provide campers with hours of diving, hiking and biking opportunities.
- POINT CAMPGROUND Located in Peter Lougheed Provincial Park in Alberta's Kananaskis Country, Point is a local favorite - and one of their best-kept secrets. This is partly because it can only be reached by a hike or paddle of about two miles. If you're not yet convinced, look up Three Isle Lakes, South Kananaskis Pass or Fossil Falls – all which can be navigated from the camp.
- WAGGONHAMMER RV PARK & CAMPGROUND With views of the Rocky Mountains, this Idaho campground along the Salmon River delivers the cozy, rustic, camping lodge atmosphere you're looking for. Fly-fishing, off-leash dog trails, hiking and boating activities make this a site worth exploring - and relaxing.
- 8) LONG KEY STATE PARK - Although Florida is packed with oceanside campgrounds, Long Key brings in more repeat visitors than all the high-end, resort-style parks. Its warm, clear waters and tree-lined, shaded campsites offer a relaxed, intimate environment not commonly available.
- FRENCHMAN RIVER VALLEY CAMPGROUND Located in Grasslands National Park in 9) Saskatchewan, the grasslands give a glimpse of what the original Canadian prairies looked like. With wildflowers, bison and black-footed ferrets roaming freely, Frenchman provides an unrivaled escape.
- 10) GRAND HAVEN STATE PARK Lake Michigan may sound like a common camper destination, but Grand Haven is so much more than meets the eye. On the eastern shoreline, the grounds are located with the lake on one side and the Grand Haven Canal on the other. Along with the pristine waterfront, its warm waters, well-maintained beaches and small-town feel from local farmer's markets and outdoor concerts promise this campsite truly has it all.






