



I will take a few lines to explain that security on this new website is compliant with the new web protocols, so for those of you that have lost or don't know your password, you will have to request a new one. You can use your Membership number, including the capital F with no spaces and click "lost password." One will be sent to your email address in our file. If you have changed your email address, please contact the VP of Membership or the President to add the new address to your file so you can then request a new password. These new passwords are long and have all kinds of characters, but you do have the option to put your own password in. In the past, Members have called us and we could look them up. That is no longer the case. Our Club keeps no copy of your password for your protection. Since we now allow payments on our website, this is the best security we can offer.


Let me also tell you that you can now renew on the website and pay as you could before. You can sign up for the rallies that we provide throughout the year here, as well. These will also be paid for on the website, which is something that has been long requested. We still offer the paper registration and accept these and checks through the mail, for those that still want to use this option.

I am also very happy to announce that Camp Freightliner classes will now be offered at our national rallies this coming year. The classes are scheduled preceding, following or straddling the rallies, and will initially only be offered to attendees of the rally. Once you have signed up for our rally, go to fcccrv.com, select "motorhome" and click the Camp Freightliner logo "learn more" – you will see the dates and registration to put the code in the space provided. These classes will be available on a first-come, first-served basis, as long as there are seats available. If we do not fill all the seats with rally attendees by the end of the registration period, they will be offered to the public.

















Something new I would like to offer is for those who attend our rallies and want to purchase parts. We will now take your order ahead of time so we can make sure parts that you would like to purchase are on the trailer. Parts available include: air filters, fuel, water separator filters and bowls, oil filters, antifreeze, air dryer filter kits, serpentine belts, Onan filters oils, fuel and air. If you have a special order, that may be handled as well. We will just need your membership number, your name, phone number and the last 6 digits of your VIN number. You can send them to me at president@fcocrv.org, and I will forward them to Freightliner.

One other request from Members is to have our Club merchandise available for purchase at our rallies, and we agreed. FCOC merchandise will now be on sale at rallies so Members can shop and figure out sizing. With somewhere around 30 to 50 percent of rally attendees being first-timers, the demand is high.

I know this seems a little early, but this issue will be in printed early November and the following issue will not be out until January 2017. So let me tell you, it has been my pleasure to talk with many of you over the phone and to meet so many wonderful RVers during the four rallies this year.

I'll be the first to wish all of you a safe and happy fall and holiday season.



Since some Members in our Club have experienced a fire in the transfer switch of their motorhome, it was discussed at length. They then went over the Progressive EMS System, as this can help save RV's. Also discussed was the need to have a first aid kit, emergency hammer, seat belt cutter knife and fire extinguishers. Fire extinguishers should be maintained yearly, but you should check the powder in the dry chemical











extinguishers more often - about every three to four month - by turning them over and making sure the powder is moving freely in the container. If not, tap the bottom with a rubber mallet to break it loose. Keeping the electrical connections tight is also very important, so they discussed the difference between 12 volt and 110 volt systems as well.

Funds raised through a 50/25/25 raffle that was held each night, as well as the proceeds of a Power Pressure Cooker XL and Coleman Fold-N-Go Grill donated by a Member to be raffled off, were gifted to a local charity. Overall, the Membership raised \$609 for the "Sid Weber Memorial Cancer Fund," dedicated to providing support to cancer patients who are residents of Rabun County, as well as to their caregivers and families. Charity President Dottie Haney and former President Connie Larsen were present to receive the check. 





# **NEW FCOC FORUMS**



There's no substitute for experience. While articles and manuals on maintaining your motorhome are useful, they can't talk back to you and help to diagnose or solve an issue. That's how online forums have often proven to be a valuable tool for motorhome owners and DIYers alike – allowing owners and problemsolvers to help each other. Chances are, if you've asked a question on a forum, someone else has been looking for the same information and benefitted from the answers you received.

When we set out to build our Club's new website, one of our primary objectives was to provide a forum for our members, and we are pleased to announce that we have accomplished this goal. There are, in fact, two distinct forum platforms available exclusively to the Club under the "Chassis Forum" menu.

#### HISTORICAL FORUM (YAHOO!)

As Yahoo! is likely to stop hosting these kinds of forums, Club President Steve Batorson obtained permission to migrate the historical data from the FCOC forum to our website. That means we have conversations going back to the days of Oshkosh Chassis that could be helpful and relevant to our current Club membership. Unfortunately, the transfer means that new conversations cannot be started on this forum, so this content is for reference only.

#### **CURRENT FORUMS**

This is your opportunity to ask questions of your fellow Club members and help them find answers to their questions. Anyone can start new conversation threads at any time, but for now, only the Club Webmaster has the ability to add new "forums," or overall topics of conversation, like maintenance or new motorhomes.

#### **RALLY REGISTRATION**

Members can now register and pay for rallies directly from the event listing on the website. Simply click on the rally you wish to attend and find the "Register & Pay Online" button at the bottom. This option doesn't replace anything, but serves as an additional method to register. Members can still print the form and mail it in with a check as well.






## OUR CANADIAN BUCKET TRIP

(NEW BRUNSWICK, PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND AND NOVA SCOTIA)



#### CENTURY FARM FAMILY CAMPGROUND IN ST. MARTINS, NEW BRUNSWICK

On our way to the caves, which can only be seen at low tide, we went through this fun antique covered bridge. In Truro, we saw the tidal bore at the Bay of Fundy, which is a true natural phenomenon. # ONLINE MEMBERSHIP UPDATE OR RENEWAL
