


LIFE'S A BEACH!

THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN MESA



Freightliner Chassis Owners Club Rally

The Freightliner Chassis Owners Club Rally date has been set! Mark your calendars for the October 23-27, 2017 event that will be held right across the street from the Charlotte Motor Speedway in Concord, North Carolina – a great stop to add to your itinerary (www.charlottemotorspeedway.com).

Those that saw our previous announcements would note Concord is a change from our original location we had planned in Myrtle Beach. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause. The location change is because we could not negotiate a price point to what our members are willing to pay. The cost of renting spaces from the last time we were in Myrtle Beach jumped from under \$35 to \$59 per night, just for camping. When you add the cost of food and entertainment, it would be approaching the \$500 mark.

For this rally, we will be using a tent – as the average temperature range for this time of year is 70's during the day, high 40's at night. There will be full hook-ups for all, 30/50 amps power, and water and sewer at every site. We will have four breakfasts and four dinners. We've also planned a Halloween party, for those who would like to participate in costume.

The Concord area offers a variety of activities and attractions. Take a day to explore the Sea Life Charlotte-Concord Aquarium and meet Neptune, their green sea turtle (www2.visitsealife.com/charlotte-concord). Enjoy a cold brew at Cabarrus Brewing Co. (www.cabarrusbrewing.com) – half production facility, half taproom, 100% local. Or perhaps let your inner thrill-seeker out for some rock climbing or waterfall rappelling with Thrifty Adventures (www.thriftyadventuresnc.com).

For those who would like to sign up for Camp Freightliner for this rally, the classes will actually be taught in Gaffney. It is about 50 miles from where the rally is taking place. These classes can be signed up for with the code you get when your registration for the rally is confirmed.

We will have updates and a reservation form on the website, as well as a more complete write up and tentative schedule in the next newsletter. We can't wait to see all of you there!






Driven By You

SHOPTAIK

TIPS, TRICKS AND MUST-DOS FOR YOUR WINTER TRIPS.

Across the country, there are so many great winter destinations, but you want to be sure to protect yourself and your motorhome in cold temperatures. While this is not a substitute from your manufacturer's recommendations, here are some important things to consider.



- Make sure your furnace is working properly before your trip. Also, be aware that it uses LP gas more quickly than you might anticipate, so plan to monitor your tank and make sure you have access to refills.
- Take the time to become familiar with the location of your motorhome's plumbing. Identify places that might be exposed to cold temperatures and take steps to insulate them or provide warmth. An easy way is to open cabinets and drawers to let warm air flow to plumbing lines.
- 3. If your holding tanks are not heated, add RV antifreeze through the toilet for the black water tank and down the shower for the gray water tank. Plan to add more antifreeze during your trip, and empty them more frequently to reduce the chance of freezing.
- 4. Try to select sites that allow for maximum sunlight throughout the day. Be sure to avoid having a sag in your sewer hookup that could freeze and plug up. If you plan to keep your freshwater hose hooked up overnight, consider investing in a heated hose, or use heat tape and insulation.
- 5 Pay attention to condensation that can quickly build up when your motorhome is heated. Be sure to use shower and range vents and, if necessary, a dehumidifier or desiccant crystals to keep down the humidity inside the coach.
- 6. Always check the slideouts for ice and snow buildup before retracting.
- 7. Most importantly, if you use a generator or portable heaters, take every precaution to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning. Make sure your whole crew knows the symptoms and understands the critical importance of taking immediate action.





GOOEY CHOCOLATE FUDGE SKILLET COOKIE

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon fine salt
- ½ cup plus 2 tablespoons unsweetened baking cocoa
- 8 tablespoons (1 stick) unsalted butter, melted
- 1 teaspoon instant espresso powder
- 4 large eggs
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup firmly packed dark brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350F
- In a small bowl, whisk flour, cocoa, espresso powder, baking powder and salt together.
- 3. In a separate, medium bowl, mix butter, eggs, vanilla and sugars.
- 4. Gradually add dry mixture to wet until combined.
- 5. Spread the batter into a well-greased 9" skillet and bake for 22 minutes for rich, gooey center (longer if you prefer less gooey result).
- 6. Serve family-style (as pictured) with ice cream and syrups or allow to cool and slice individually.
- Note: Can be stored for three days. To make into cookies, chill the mixture overnight. Proceed by rolling 1 tablespoon of dough into balls, coating in powdered sugar and baking on parchment-lined cookie sheets for 10-12 minutes. Keep extra dough in fridge while baking.




