



Whether a NASCAR fan or not, you will enjoy the high-tech venue, interactive entertainment and state-of-the-art theater lodged within the Hall of Fame. It honors the history and heritage of NASCAR while educating and amusing visitors with artifacts, hands-on exhibits and tributes to drivers, crew members, team owners and others that have made an impact on the sport's past, present and future.

Our tour will conclude at the Sam Bass Museum – the site of world-renowned and internationally recognized artist Sam Bass' collection of motorsport-inspired art (www.sambass.com). The connection began when he attended his first NASCAR race at seven years old, and has only continued to grow his joy, thrill and enthusiasm. Time for a factory tour is not included in the Camp Freightliner itinerary, so plan an extra day before or after class for this one-of-a-kind experience. You won't want to miss it!



ROADTRIPPING WITH ROVER

No one wants to leave the family pet behind – they're man's best friend, after all! But traveling with a dog, cat or any other household pet has its challenges, to say the least. There are, however, many tips and tricks to make the trip easy and enjoyable.

PET-PROOFING YOUR RV

- Not necessarily RV-related, but crate training is the first recommended step to taking your dog on the road.
 Not only does it ensure your rig's interior remains intact when you have to step away from camp, but it keeps Fido safe when the RV is moving.
- Placing dog beds on the floor or throw blankets on couches will keep the wear and tear of your RV furniture
 to a minimum. Claw caps allow you to relax knowing your cat's claws aren't damaging the sofa as well and
 come in a variety of colors.
- Ramps are perfect for older animals that can't make the jump and younger animals with lots of energy helping to eliminate the chance of scratching on the bed frame or rig itself.
- Baby gates are lightweight, inexpensive and great for confining your animal when need be. Pet nets are the perfect alternative for cats.



KEEPING YOUR PET SAFE, COMFORTABLE AND WELL-MAINTAINED

- Place a few of the pet's belongings around the RV and allow them to get acquainted with the space without any pressure. If the animal shows any signs of anxiety (drooling, whining, pacing), the best thing to do is ignore it. Picking them up or paying attention to the behavior reinforces it. Simply stay with your pet and speak in a soothing voice until they are calm enough to handle as normal. Feeding treats during this process is a great way to associate the new space with happy memories and things they enjoy.
- Eliminate food temptations and areas of curiosity. Just like a child, your animal will want to investigate every nook and cranny, so keep anything that would be harmful, unhealthy or damageable out of reach.
- Create a space that is theirs. An empty battery bay is the perfect place to hide a litter box – and an empty storage compartment is a great place for a bed.
- Make sure you are up to date on all your animal's shots. Though
 you may take exceptional care of your pet, there are many
 dangers and diseases on the road. Keep vet records on hand,
 as well as all medication prescribed and over-the-counter
 medicines like flea & tick guard or relaxers for anxious animals.
- And to assure your RV park neighbors' peace of mind, always scoop the poop and leash the beast.

Get The Most From Your Allison-Equipped Motorhome

Allison Motorhome Series™ fully automatic transmissions provide customized performance at your fingertips. The transmission will automatically select gears based on engine rpm, throttle position, vehicle load and road speed. However, you can manually control the upshifts and downshifts when it is necessary for driving in different conditions. To avoid damage to the drivetrain, the transmission will not allow you to select a range that will over-speed the engine.



Highway Driving (Level Terrain)

Operating in the Drive mode is recommended when driving in normal highway conditions.



Mountainous Driving (Up & Down Terrain)

When ascending a grade, gently release pressure on the throttle and select a lower gear range to maintain higher engine rpm. Road speed may decrease, but power (torque) will remain at peak output. When descending a grade, never use a higher gear range than was used ascending the same grade. Selecting a lower gear range will also minimize cycling between ranges on a series of short up and down hills.



City Driving (Stop & Go Traffic)¹

To maximize performance select the lowest gear range that allows the vehicle to reach the speed you expect to attain between stops. This will minimize cycling between higher ranges and provide better vehicle cooling while driving in stop-and-go conditions.



Winter Driving (Ice Or Snow)²

If possible, reduce road speed and select a lower gear range before you lose traction. Select the gear range that will not exceed the speed you expect to maintain. Accelerate or decelerate gradually to prevent losing traction. It is very important to gradually slow down when a lower gear range is selected. It is also important to allow the transmission to reach the lower gear range before attempting to accelerate. This will avoid an unexpected downshift during acceleration.



Engine Braking³

Engine braking provides good speed control for going down grades. When the vehicle is heavily loaded or the grade is steep, it may be desirable to preselect a lower range reaching the grade. If engine-governed speed is exceeded, the transmission will upshift automatically to the next range.

- 1 In the event you leave the vehicle or driving compartment, even momentarily, while the engine is running, be sure the transmission is in Neutral and the parking brake and/or emergency brakes are set and properly engaged. Unexpected and possible sudden vehicle movement may occur if these precautions are not taken.
- 2 Using the retarder on wet or slippery roads may cause loss of traction on the drive wheels—your vehicle may slide out of control. To help avoid injury or property damage, turn the retarder enable to OFF when driving on wet or slippery roads. The retarder is automatically disabled whenever the vehicle anti-lock brake system (ABS) is active. However, in case the ABS malfunctions, it is recommended that the
- 3 To avoid loss of control, use a combination of downshifting, braking and other retarding devices. Downshifting to a lower transmission range increases engine braking and can help you maintain control. The transmission has a feature to prevent automatic upshifting above the lower range selected. However, during downhill operation, if engine-governed speed is exceeded in the lower range, the transmission will upshift to the next higher range to prevent engine damage. This will reduce engine braking and could cause a loss of control. Apply the vehicle brakes or other retarding device to prevent exceeding engine-governed speed in the lower range selected.



GRILLED CORN SALSA

INGREDIENTS:

- 4 ears of corn
- 1 pint grape or cherry tomatoes, halved
- 2 avocados, diced
- 1 small red onion, thinly sliced
- 1 handful of basil, thinly sliced
- 2 lemons, juiced
- 3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Pita chips

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Grill the ears of corn, and then cut off the cob.
- 2. Combine corn, tomatoes, avocados and onion.
- 3. Gently toss in basil and mix together.
- 4. Whisk lemon juice with olive oil, and then pour over the salsa.
- 5. Season with salt and pepper. Stir to coat.
- 6. Serve chilled or at room temperature with pita chips.

TROPICAL SHRIMP PARFAIT

INGREDIENTS:

- 3/4 pound shrimp, peeled, deveined, cooked and cut into medium dice
- 1 large avocado, diced
- 1/2 cup grape tomatoes, halved
- ½ cup cucumbers, diced
- 1/2 cup mango, diced
- 1 large orange
- 1 lime
- Olive oil
- Honey

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Layer ingredients in two glasses at a time, in order: shrimp, avocado, tomatoes, cucumber, mango. Repeat.
- 2. Squeeze orange and lime over both parfaits.
- 3. Finish with a drizzle of olive oil and honey, to taste.

ASIAN CHICKEN SALAD

INGREDIENTS:

- 4 cups baby spinach
- 1/2 cup chow mein noodles
- 1 cup snow peas, chopped
- 1 lb. skinless, boneless chicken breast
- Kikkoman wasabi sauce (to taste)
- Finely chopped carrot slices

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Season chicken with salt and pepper and grill
- 2. Let sit 2 minutes before slicing into bite-size pieces.
- 3. Mix baby spinach, chicken pieces, carrot slices, snow peas and chow mein noodles in large bowl. Top with Kikkoman wasabi sauce to taste.
