

Get The Most From Your Allison-Equipped Motorhome

Allison Motorhome Series™ fully automatic transmissions provide customized performance at your fingertips. The transmission will automatically select gears based on engine rpm, throttle position, vehicle load and road speed. However, you can manually control the upshifts and downshifts when it is necessary for driving in different conditions. To avoid damage to the drivetrain, the transmission will not allow you to select a range that will over-speed the engine.



Highway Driving (Level Terrain)

Operating in the Drive mode is recommended when driving in normal highway conditions.



Mountainous Driving (Up & Down Terrain)

When ascending a grade, gently release pressure on the throttle and select a lower gear range to maintain higher engine rpm. Road speed may decrease, but power (torque) will remain at peak output. When descending a grade, never use a higher gear range than was used ascending the same grade. Selecting a lower gear range will also minimize cycling between ranges on a series of short up and down hills.



City Driving (Stop & Go Traffic)1

To maximize performance select the lowest gear range that allows the vehicle to reach the speed you expect to attain between stops. This will minimize cycling between higher ranges and provide better vehicle cooling while driving in stop-and-go conditions.



Winter Driving (Ice Or Snow)²

If possible, reduce road speed and select a lower gear range before you lose traction. Select the gear range that will not exceed the speed you expect to maintain. Accelerate or decelerate gradually to prevent losing traction. It is very important to gradually slow down when a lower gear range is selected. It is also important to allow the transmission to reach the lower gear range before attempting to accelerate. This will avoid an unexpected downshift during acceleration.



Engine Braking³

Engine braking provides good speed control for going down grades. When the vehicle is heavily loaded or the grade is steep, it may be desirable to preselect a lower range reaching the grade. If engine-governed speed is exceeded, the transmission will upshift automatically to the next range.

- 1 In the event you leave the vehicle or driving compartment, even momentarily, while the engine is running, be sure the transmission is in Neutral and the parking brake and/or emergency brakes are set and properly engaged. Unexpected and possible sudden vehicle movement may occur if these precautions are not taken.
- 2 Using the retarder on wet or slippery roads may cause loss of traction on the drive wheels—your vehicle may slide out of control. To help avoid injury or property damage, turn the retarder enable to OFF when driving on wet or slippery roads. The retarder is automatically disabled whenever the vehicle anti-lock brake system (ABS) is active. However, in case the ABS malfunctions, it is recommended that the retarder enable switch, if present, be disabled.
- 3 To avoid loss of control, use a combination of downshifting, braking and other retarding devices. Downshifting to a lower transmission range increases engine braking and can help you maintain control. The transmission has a feature to prevent automatic upshifting above the lower range selected. However, during downhill operation, if engine-governed speed is exceeded in the lower range, the transmission will upshift to the next higher range to prevent engine damage. This will reduce engine braking and could cause a loss of control. Apply the vehicle brakes or other retarding device to prevent exceeding engine-governed speed in the lower range selected.



Time for a factory tour is not included in the Camp Freightliner itinerary, so plan an extra day before or after class for this one-of-akind experience. You won't want to miss it!

In a conversation the other day, the question came up about when the first motorhome was really made. The inquiry really got me thinking and I realized that some form of "mobile home" or "house car" (as they were once called), has been around since at least the 1700-1800s. The Conestoga wagon, used for transporting goods and material, and the Prairie Schooner, created for the purpose of long-distance travel – albeit powered by a team of horses – were both early forms of mobile homes. They provided a place to sleep and carried all the necessary living needs and equipment of the time - including water, which was caught in rain barrels attached to the side of the wagon. The kitchen, of course, was a separate unit known as the chuck wagon. Though they lacked the modern conveniences we enjoy today, they served the same function of carrying occupants to various destinations. Americans used these modes of transportation for nearly two centuries until more modern transportation like the railroad and, eventually, the automobile came into play.

As early as the 1900s, people started modifying cars and trucks to create their own versions of what we now know as a motorhome. Many of the first RVs were built by hand and, in some instances, were built as a separate unit – commonly known as a towable vehicle. A more-modern form of motorhome was apparently introduced back in 1910 by the Pierce-Arrow Motor Company. It was known as the "Touring Landau Model" and was presented at the auto show in Madison Square Garden. It provided storage compartments, some camping equipment and yes, it even had an on-board toilet. But, it wasn't until the 1920s that the builders and manufacturers started converting trucks and buses for camping use.

It was in this period that "RV camping" really got its start.

Unfortunately, manufacturing was short lived, and production was halted during World War II due to rationing. It did not resume again until the 1950s. Later that decade, motorized RVs became more popular, but were considered to be an expensive luxury. They were not

as popular as travel trailers until 1967 when Winnebago introduced their five models of motorhomes, which varied in length from 16 to 27 feet and sold for as much as \$5,000. From there, the modern motorhome began to emerge.

The RV-MH Museum and Hall of Fame in Elkhart, IN, is an awesome place to walk through the history of RVs. In their Founder's Hall, there are over 50 vintage vehicles. This room is fun to explore - as the floor is painted like a highway that winds its way through history and the displays are set up to give you that campground feel. Along the "road," you will encounter a 1913 travel trailer that is believed to be the oldest in existence, a 1915 Model T with multiple slideouts, and various housecar conversions, pop-ups, travel trailers and motorhomes. There are exhibits that would qualify as strange, such as a 1916 Model T "Telescoping Apartment" or a 1935 Bowlus Road Chief, which looks like an Airstream with a fish tail. There is also a Chevrolet Housecar, built by Paramount in 1931 to bribe Mae West into making movies. The world's oldest Winnebago, from 1967, is also on display - along with the smallest Airstream ever built. We found it fascinating to walk through and see the changes in technology from those early beginnings to the 1980s where the museum's road through history ends. Truly a trip worth taking if you are going to be in or around the Elkhart area. You can visit their website here: www.rvmhhalloffame.org.

From 1950 to 2018, RVing has become an increasingly popular way to spend time with family and see this beautiful country. There are estimated to be over 12,000 campgrounds – including state and national parks, as well as local campsites – in the United States. Statistics show that in the spring of 2017, the number of people who went camping in the previous 12-month period amounted to 46.95 million.

They're looking forward to the FCOC Rally in Junction City, OR, followed by a trip to Alaska and a cruise - and then ending the year with the FCOC Rally in Tennessee before heading home for winter. All in all, Steve and Kim are looking at about 15,000+ miles in their coach for 2018 - and many, many more in the future.





OVERNIGHT CROCK-POT CASSEROLE

Prep time: 20 minutes Cook time: 8 hours Servings: 8-10

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 lb. frozen bag hash brown potatoes, diced or shredded
- 1 cup onion, diced small
- 1 ½ cups bell pepper (any color or a mix), diced small
- 1 ½ cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 lb. hot or mild turkey sausage (could substitute with pork sausage, ham or bacon), cooked and crumbled
- 12 large eggs
- ¾ cup milk

- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- ½ teaspoon black pepper
- ½ teaspoon ground mustard
- ½ teaspoon garlic powder
- ¼ teaspoon red pepper flakes (optional)

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Place frozen hash browns in the bottom of slow cooker (use cooking spray if you're worried about sticking).
- 2. Place chopped onion and peppers over the potatoes.
- 3. Next, layer the cooked sausage and top with shredded cheese.
- 4. In a medium bowl, whisk together the eggs and remaining ingredients, and then pour over the top of the cheese.
- 5. Cover with lid and cook 8-9 hours on low.
- 6. Delicious when served with a variety of toppings, including shredded cheese, diced tomatoes or salsa, sour cream or Greek yogurt, avocado, green onions, cilantro or hot sauce.

SLOW-COOKER CINNAMON ROLL MONKEY BREAD

Prep time: 20 minutes Cook time: 2 hours Servings: 8-10

The monkey bread will stick as it cools. We recommend removing while warm to avoid a long soak.

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 cans Grands! cinnamon rolls (5 per
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ cup brown sugar
- ½ cup unsalted butter, melted

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Open cans of cinnamon rolls and cut each roll into six pieces. (Reserve the icing.)
- 2. Place granulated sugar and cinnamon in gallon Ziploc bag. Add cinnamon roll pieces, seal and shake to coat. (They will fall apart a little, so no worries!)
- 3. Stir brown sugar and melted butter together.
- 4. Spray a 5-7 quart slow cooker with nonstick cooking spray. Place half the dough pieces in the bottom and cover with half the melted butter mixture. Repeat.
- 5. Cover the slow cooker and cook on high for about two hours. (We recommend checking at one hour, and then again after another 30 minutes – just to be safe). The edges will start to brown, but the top will still be a little gooey-looking. Turn off the slow cooker and let sit for five minutes before serving.
- 6. Drizzle the icing over the top of the monkey bread in the crockpot.




