Get The Most From Your Allison-Equipped Motorhome

Allison Motorhome Series™ fully automatic transmissions provide customized performance at your fingertips. The transmission will automatically select gears based on engine rpm, throttle position, vehicle load and road speed. However, you can manually control the upshifts and downshifts when it is necessary for driving in different conditions. To avoid damage to the drivetrain, the transmission will not allow you to select a range that will over-speed the engine.



Highway Driving (Level Terrain)

Operating in the Drive mode is recommended when driving in normal highway conditions.



Mountainous Driving (Up & Down Terrain)

When ascending a grade, gently release pressure on the throttle and select a lower gear range to maintain higher engine rpm. Road speed may decrease, but power (torque) will remain at peak output. When descending a grade, never use a higher gear range than was used ascending the same grade. Selecting a lower gear range will also minimize cycling between ranges on a series of short up and down hills.



City Driving (Stop & Go Traffic)¹

To maximize performance select the lowest gear range that allows the vehicle to reach the speed you expect to attain between stops. This will minimize cycling between higher ranges and provide better vehicle cooling while driving in stop-and-go conditions.



Winter Driving (Ice Or Snow)²

If possible, reduce road speed and select a lower gear range before you lose traction. Select the gear range that will not exceed the speed you expect to maintain. Accelerate or decelerate gradually to prevent losing traction. It is very important to gradually slow down when a lower gear range is selected. It is also important to allow the transmission to reach the lower gear range before attempting to accelerate. This will avoid an unexpected downshift during acceleration.



Engine Braking³

Engine braking provides good speed control for going down grades. When the vehicle is heavily loaded or the grade is steep, it may be desirable to preselect a lower range reaching the grade. If engine-governed speed is exceeded, the transmission will upshift automatically to the next range.

- 1 In the event you leave the vehicle or driving compartment, even momentarily, while the engine is running, be sure the transmission is in Neutral and the parking brake and/or emergency brakes are set and properly engaged. Unexpected and possible sudden vehicle movement may occur if these precautions are not taken.
- 2 Using the retarder on wet or slippery roads may cause loss of traction on the drive wheels—your vehicle may slide out of control. To help avoid injury or property damage, turn the retarder enable to OFF when driving on wet or slippery roads. The retarder is automatically disabled whenever the vehicle anti-lock brake system (ABS) is active. However, in case the ABS malfunctions, it is recommended that the retarder enable switch, if present, be disabled.
- 3 To avoid loss of control, use a combination of downshifting, braking and other retarding devices. Downshifting to a lower transmission range increases engine braking and can help you maintain control. The transmission has a feature to prevent automatic upshifting above the lower range selected. However, during downhill operation, if engine-governed speed is exceeded in the lower range, the transmission will upshift to the next higher range to prevent engine damage. This will reduce engine braking and could cause a loss of control. Apply the vehicle brakes or other retarding device to prevent exceeding engine-governed speed in the lower range selected.






ADJUSTING YOUR RV'S RIDE HEIGHT

All motor vehicles are designed to ride at a specific ride height to allow the vehicle's ride, drive and all other individual components to function together properly. On a motorhome, ride height is the setting for the air suspension on your chassis. Any adjustments outside the proper band can create an adverse effect on the driveline, and also impact other drivability issues. When ride heights are not set properly, two important factors are affected:

- 1. The front ride height will change the front-axle caster settings. This can affect the handling of your coach on the highway, as well as tire wear.
- 2. The rear ride height will change the drive-shaft angles. Incorrect drive-shaft angles can cause driveline noise (vibration or a growling sound) and can cause premature wear of the U-joints on the driveline.

Make a visual inspection around your coach before each trip - take note of proper ride height and always be aware of how your coach is riding and driving. At the very least, ride height should be checked at each scheduled maintenance interval. This differs chassis to chassis: individual manufacturers provide a recommended interval of length of time and number of miles whichever you reach first.

We recommend that you have ride heights checked at an authorized Freightliner dealer. You can also purchase an FCCC Workshop manual from an authorized dealer for proper ride height checking and setting information.

SAVE TIME AND MONEY WITH THE RV E-ZPASS

The RV E-ZPass was founded in 1987 to help automate the collection process at toll roads, bridges and tunnels. Currently in use in 16 Midwestern and Northeastern states, there is an ongoing effort to make it a nation-wide system. Since its inception, various systems such as the I-Pass of Illinois and the Quick Pass in North Carolina have been added to the E-ZPass system.

Now, one would guess that most veteran RV'ers from the Midwestern and Northeastern states are familiar with the benefits of the E-ZPass, but we are always surprised by the number of people that seem to know little to nothing about it. Yes, there is an E-ZPass for the RV that is different from the one you use in your car. Besides saving you a quite a bit of money, the pass can also save lots of time - if you've ever come up to a toll plaza and seen the never-ending vehicles in the "cash only" lanes, you know what we're talking about.

There is a little bit of homework you have to do up front to get started. The first step is to setup a pre-paid account. You can create a cash/checking account or a credit card account. The E-ZPass system will maintain your account balance and use, which can be emailed to you depending on your usage. There is also an automated telephone number you can call for your balance. If you have a credit card account, your balance will automatically be replenished when you go below the threshold. If you have a cash/checking account, you will be notified when your account needs to be replenished,



and in some cases may even see a "Low Balance" message as you pass through a toll booth. Replenish amounts are calculated to equal one month of average use over the previous 90 days, so the amounts can vary.

For motor coaches, proof of your registration is required to receive the special discount. You will get the passenger vehicle rate, which is based on the number of axles. The height of your motorhome may also come into play on the tolls if you are over a certain number. Once you setup and create your pre-paid account, you are issued an electronic device or transponder that goes in your RV. As you pass through the E-ZPass toll lane, payment is automatically deducted from your account. There is also a mobile app available to help you stay up to date on the status of your E-ZPass account.



CROCK-POT PULLED CHICKEN

Prep time: 10 minutes Cook time: 4 hours, 40 minutes Servings: 8

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon butter (or extra-virgin olive oil, avocado oil or coconut oil)
- 1½ cups ketchup
- 3 tablespoons cider vinegar
- ½ cup apricot preserves (pineapple or peach works also)
- 2 tablespoons
 Worcestershire sauce
- 2 teaspoons liquid smoke (optional)
- er 2 tablespoons molasses
 - Dash of allspice

- ¼ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- ¼ teaspoon ground cayenne pepper (to taste)
- 1 lb. boneless chicken breasts
- 1 lb. boneless chicken thighs
- 8 split sandwich buns

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Melt butter in medium saucepan over medium heat. Add the onions and cook until they are softened and lightly browned (6-10 minutes). Add the garlic and cook for about 1 minute longer stirring constantly.
- 2. Add ketchup, apricot preserves, vinegar, Worcestershire, liquid smoke, molasses, allspice, black pepper and cayenne. Bring to a simmer and cook for 5 minutes.
- 3. Measure 1-½ cups of the sauce mixture and pour it into the crock-pot. Reserve the remaining sauce in a container and refrigerate until serving time.
- 4. Add the chicken pieces. Cover and cook on low for 4-½ to 5 hours, or until chicken is tender and easy to shred. Use a fork to shred.
- 5. Lightly butter the split buns and toast, face down.

SLOW COOKER CORN ON THE COB

Prep time: 5 minutes Cook time: 4 hours, 30 minutes Servings: 6-8

INGREDIENTS:

- 6-8 ears of corn1 tablespoon melted
- butter
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- 6-8 bacon slices, cooked but not crisp

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. For each corn cob, lay one square of aluminum foil on the counter.
- 2. Place one cob in the center of the foil, brush lightly with butter, sprinkle with salt and pepper and place torn pieces of bacon on top. (You don't want the bacon to be crisp, as the remaining fat will flavor the corn as it cooks.)
- 3. Place in slow cooker and repeat.
- 4. Cover and cook on low for about 4-½ hours, or on high for about 2 to 2-½ hours.



TIP: Take your corn on the cob to the next level – Mexican Street Corn! Brush with mayonnaise, thoroughly coat with Cotija cheese, add some cilantro and sprinkle with chili powder. Squeeze a lime over the cobs, salt and enjoy!

HOT BACON CHEESE DIP

Prep time: 15 minutes Cook time: 2 hours Makes: 4 cups

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 packages (8 ounces each) cream cheese, cubed
- 4 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 cup half-and-half cream
- 2 teaspoons
 Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon dried minced onion
- 1 teaspoon prepared mustard
- 16 bacon strips, cooked and crumbled
- Tortilla chips or French bread slices

DIRECTIONS:

- Combine the first six ingredients in a 1½-quart slow cooker. Cover and cook on low for 2-3 hours – or until cheese is melted. Stir occasionally.
- 2. Just before serving, stir in bacon crumbles.
- 3. Serve warm with tortilla chips or bread.




