The transmission will automatically select gears based on engine rpm, throttle position, vehicle load and road speed. However, you can manually control the upshifts and downshifts when it is necessary for driving in different conditions. To avoid damage to the drivetrain, the transmission will not allow you to select a range that will over-speed the engine.



Highway Driving (Level Terrain)

Operating in the Drive mode is recommended when driving in normal highway conditions.



Mountainous Driving (Up & Down Terrain)

When ascending a grade, gently release pressure on the throttle and select a lower gear range to maintain higher engine rpm. Road speed may decrease, but power (torque) will remain at peak output. When descending a grade, never use a higher gear range than was used ascending the same grade. Selecting a lower gear range will also minimize cycling between ranges on a series of short up and down hills.



City Driving (Stop & Go Traffic)¹

To maximize performance select the lowest gear range that allows the vehicle to reach the speed you expect to attain between stops. This will minimize cycling between higher ranges and provide better vehicle cooling while driving in stop-and-go conditions.



Winter Driving (Ice Or Snow)²

If possible, reduce road speed and select a lower gear range before you lose traction. Select the gear range that will not exceed the speed you expect to maintain. Accelerate or decelerate gradually to prevent losing traction. It is very important to gradually slow down when a lower gear range is selected. It is also important to allow the transmission to reach the lower gear range before attempting to accelerate. This will avoid an unexpected downshift during acceleration.



Engine Braking³

Engine braking provides good speed control for going down grades. When the vehicle is heavily loaded or the grade is steep, it may be desirable to preselect a lower range reaching the grade. If engine-governed speed is exceeded, the transmission will upshift automatically to the next range.

- 1 In the event you leave the vehicle or driving compartment, even momentarily, while the engine is running, be sure the transmission is in Neutral and the parking brake and/or emergency brakes are set and properly engaged. Unexpected and possible sudden vehicle movement may occur if these precautions are not taken.
- 2 Using the retarder on wet or slippery roads may cause loss of traction on the drive wheels—your vehicle may slide out of control. To help avoid injury or property damage, turn the retarder enable to OFF when driving on wet or slippery roads. The retarder is automatically disabled whenever the vehicle anti-lock brake system (ABS) is active. However, in case the ABS malfunctions, it is recommended that the retarder enable switch, if present, be disabled.
- 3 To avoid loss of control, use a combination of downshifting, braking and other retarding devices. Downshifting to a lower transmission range increases engine braking and can help you maintain control. The transmission has a feature to prevent automatic upshifting above the lower range selected. However, during downhill operation, if engine-governed speed is exceeded in the lower range, the transmission will upshift to the next higher range to prevent engine damage. This will reduce engine braking and could cause a loss of control. Apply the vehicle brakes or other retarding device to prevent exceeding engine-governed speed in the lower range selected.





BRANSON LANDING WATER & FIRE SHOW: Located along a scenic boardwalk, the fountains are at the heart of the town square and feature an awe-inspiring merging of water, fire, light and music. RUTH AND PAUL HENNING CONSERVATION AREA: Located 5.3 miles west of Route several trails that draws visitors from all over the world. SLOW COOKER PULLED-PORK SANDWICHES WITH CABBAGE SLAW

Prep time: 15 minutes Cook time: 8 hours Servings: 4

PORK:

- ½ cup ketchup
- ¼ cup brown sugar, packed
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- ¼ cup cider vinegar
- ½ teaspoon Kosher salt and pepper
- 1 pork butt or shoulder

CABBAGE:

- ½ cup low-fat sour cream
- 2 tablespoons vinegar
- 1 tablespoon water
- ½ teaspoon Kosher salt and pepper
- ½ small green cabbage (about 1 lb.)
- ½ cup fresh cilantro
- 4 rolls

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Whisk together ketchup, sugar, chili, vinegar, salt and pepper. Add to your slow cooker.
- 2. Add pork and toss to coat.
- 3. Cook, covered, until pork is tender and shreds easily (7-8 hours on low or 4-5 hours on high).
- 4. Forty-five minutes before serving, whisk together sour cream, vinegar, water, salt and pepper. Core and thinly slice cabbage, add it to the sour cream mixture and toss to coat. Fold in cilantro before serving.
- 5. Using two forks, shred pork into large pieces. Gently toss to mix in the cooking liquid for flavor. Fill rolls with pork and slaw.

TIP:

Serve with chips and pickles. Can also replace pork with brisket (2 lbs.; trimmed of excess fat) or chicken thighs (2 lbs. boneless, skinless). Cook as directed for brisket; decrease cooking time by two hours for chicken.

SLOW COOKER S'MORES BROWNIES

Prep time: 25 min Cool

Cook time: 2-3 hours

Servings: 15

CRUST:

- 3 cups graham cracker crumbs (approximately 18 graham cracker sheets)
- ¾ cup butter, melted
- ½ cup sugar

BROWNIES:

- ½ cup butter
- 8 ounces bittersweet chocolate, chopped
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 large eggs
- 1 ¼ cups all-purpose flour
- ¼ cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- ¾ teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 cup semisweet chocolate chips
- 4 Hershey milk chocolate bars
- 10 ounces miniature marshmallows

DIRECTIONS:

- Prepare slow cooker by lining it with one sheet of parchment paper and lightly greasing with non-stick spray.
 Do not turn on yet.
- For the crust, mix together graham cracker crumbs, melted butter and sugar. Press mixture into bottom of lined slow cooker.
- In a medium saucepan over medium heat, melt butter and bittersweet chocolate together. Remove from heat.
- 4. Add sugar and combine completely.
- 5. Mix in eggs, one at a time, mixing in between each addition.
- 6. Stir in flour, cocoa powder, baking powder and salt.

- Fold in chocolate chips and spread batter evenly over the graham cracker crust.
- Break apart Hershey bars and place on top of brownie batter.
- 9. Cover and cook on low for 2-2.5 hours.
- When brownies pass the toothpick test (check at 2 hours), top with marshmallows and replace cover for 5-10 minutes until melted. (Can also place under broiler to toast marshmallows.)
- 11. When ready to serve, lift brownies from slow cooker using parchment paper and cut into 3-inch pieces.

MAKE TRAVEL BETWEEN THE U.S. AND CANADA EASIER WITH THE NEXUS CARD

If you have traveled between the U.S. and Canada, you are probably aware of the long waits that can greet you at the border crossings or TSA lines. They can take forever and there really isn't much you can do about it. However, if you have a NEXUS card, those border crossings and airport queues can be a whole lot better!

NEXUS is one of four trusted traveler programs available from the Department of Homeland Security and is specifically intended for those who frequently travel between the United States and Canada. The main benefit of NEXUS is that it allows for significantly reduced wait times at designated land border crossings. I should note right here that I am quite sure you cannot use the NEXUS card with an RV because of the rules and regulations. But it's perfect for use with tow cars, since many of us camp near states bordering Canada and like to cross the border on day trips.

This past year, my husband and I applied for a NEXUS card because we wanted to be able to more easily cross back and forth at the U.S. and Canadian border by car. Membership into the NEXUS program is \$50.00 per person for a five-year membership, and there are dedicated NEXUS lanes at land border crossings so you can avoid long wait lines. When you use a NEXUS lane, you can just stop and scan your card at the card reader, then proceed to the booth for a visual inspection; unless you're directed to an inspection area, you can pass right through into Canada or the U.S.

Other benefits:

• NEXUS includes TSA pre-check, which is a wonderful perk for air travelers, and you can use NEXUS Kiosks when you are entering Canada via air

• If you have a NEXUS card, you can use Global Entry Kiosks when you enter the United States via air from other countries (Global Entry is another trusted traveler program from the Department of Homeland Security)

GETTING A NEXUS CARD

The process is simple but it does take time, so if you are planning on getting a NEXUS card, you need to plan ahead.

Apply Online

The first step is to apply online. You can go to the following website for the initial application: https://ttp.cbp.dhs.gov/

Interview

Once your background check and application have been accepted and approved, you will be required to schedule an inperson interview. You can choose the enrollment center closest to you; these are listed on their website. This process does require you to be photographed and finger printed.

The interview we had was really quite painless and did not take very long at all. You will be interviewed by agents of both the United States and Canada. Once the interview is complete, the NEXUS cards will be mailed to you, usually within a couple weeks, but there may be exceptions. Again, if you are planning on getting one, plan ahead! This process takes time.

Follow the Rules

As with any program, and especially one that deals with security, there are rules and regulations that must be obeyed. Acceptance into the NEXUS program means you are being held to a much higher standard and are expected to adhere to all regulations.

In order to use your NEXUS card at the border, everyone traveling with you must have a NEXUS card. You cannot cross the border by vehicle using a NEXUS lane if there is someone in the car that does not have it.

If you are accepted into the program, the rules for crossing the border in a NEXUS lane may differ from those in the regular lane. So, for instance, you may be able to carry something like a knife or firearm across the border in a regular lane, but it is totally not acceptable in a NEXUS lane. Either of these two offenses—along with others—could cause you to permanently lose your card, so you need to pay close attention to the rules.

All the rules and regulations of the NEXUS card are thoroughly explained in your interview process, but there is also ample documentation with this information provided to you as well. There is also a list on the website of things that might render you ineligible for this program. Both the United States and Canada must approve your application. If either one of them denies the application, you will not be eligible for the program.

I am new to this program and definitely not a NEXUS expert, but I thought it would be helpful to give you a little bit of information. This program may not be for everyone, but it might be worth looking into if you are camping near the border and want to do day trips to Canada or are a frequent visitor of either country.

PREPARING YOUR RV FOR STORAGE

Football season has started and winter is close on its heels. Some of us are lucky enough to keep our RVs on the road all year long, but for many, fall means it's time to put the motorhome away for a few months. As anyone who has ever left lasagna in the freezer can tell you, it's important to be thorough and thoughtful when preparing your RV for storage.

This goes for your chassis as well. When storing your motorhome for an extended period of time-60 days or more-the steps outlined on the checklist below should be taken to give it maximum protection. Depending on the make and model of your motorhome, there will certainly be additional items for your checklist. Be sure to reference your owner's manual for more information.

- Fill fuel tank and add a high-quality fuel stabilizer to the fuel (never store with a partially full tank of fuel).
- Change the engine oil and filter (used oil does not give adequate protection).
- Cooling system was originally protected with antifreeze to -34 degrees F. If colder temperatures are expected, adjust the mixture. If coolant has been in the vehicle for five years or 100,000 miles, flush the cooling system and fill with an appropriate mixture of antifreeze and softened water, and be sure that the coolant contains a rust inhibitor.
- If it has been more than 18 months or 24,000 miles since the transmission has been serviced, change the fluid and filter.
- Service the fuel filters.
- Run the engine until fully warmed up.
- Operate the air conditioning.

- If possible, store the vehicle in a dry, well-ventilated area, protected from sunlight.
- Check tires for damage and set tire pressure to maximum as indicated on the sidewall of the tire. Clean the tires using the normal, mild soap that you would use to clean your RV.
- If possible, raise the vehicle onto safety stands. Do not store the vehicle on the hydraulic leveling jacks. Hydraulic jacks will "bleed" pressure over time, lowering the coach back onto the tires.
- Cover tires to protect from heat and sunlight.
- If possible, release the parking brake.
- Remove and clean the battery. Always disconnect the negative (-) cable first. Store the battery in a cool, dry place and keep it charged.
- Lubricate all grease fittings on the chassis and drivetrain.
- Cover all engine and transmission openings with moistureresistant tape.


