Get The Most From Your Allison-Equipped Motorhome

Allison Motorhome Series™ fully automatic transmissions provide customized performance at your fingertips. The transmission will automatically select gears based on engine rpm, throttle position, vehicle load and road speed. However, you can manually control the upshifts and downshifts when it is necessary for driving in different conditions. To avoid damage to the drivetrain, the transmission will not allow you to select a range that will over-speed the engine.



Highway Driving (Level Terrain)

Operating in the Drive mode is recommended when driving in normal highway conditions.



Mountainous Driving (Up & Down Terrain)

When ascending a grade, gently release pressure on the throttle and select a lower gear range to maintain higher engine rpm. Road speed may decrease, but power (torque) will remain at peak output. When descending a grade, never use a higher gear range than was used ascending the same grade. Selecting a lower gear range will also minimize cycling between ranges on a series of short up and down hills.



City Driving (Stop & Go Traffic)¹

To maximize performance select the lowest gear range that allows the vehicle to reach the speed you expect to attain between stops. This will minimize cycling between higher ranges and provide better vehicle cooling while driving in stop-and-go conditions.



Winter Driving (Ice Or Snow)²

If possible, reduce road speed and select a lower gear range before you lose traction. Select the gear range that will not exceed the speed you expect to maintain. Accelerate or decelerate gradually to prevent losing traction. It is very important to gradually slow down when a lower gear range is selected. It is also important to allow the transmission to reach the lower gear range before attempting to accelerate. This will avoid an unexpected downshift during acceleration.



Engine Braking³

Engine braking provides good speed control for going down grades. When the vehicle is heavily loaded or the grade is steep, it may be desirable to preselect a lower range reaching the grade. If engine-governed speed is exceeded, the transmission will upshift automatically to the next range.

- 1 In the event you leave the vehicle or driving compartment, even momentarily, while the engine is running, be sure the transmission is in Neutral and the parking brake and/or emergency brakes are set and properly engaged. Unexpected and possible sudden vehicle movement
- 2 Using the retarder on wet or slippery roads may cause loss of traction on the drive wheels—your vehicle may slide out of control. To help avoid injury or property damage, turn the retarder enable to OFF when driving on wet or slippery roads. The retarder is automatically disabled whenever the vehicle anti-lock brake system (ABS) is active. However, in case the ABS malfunctions, it is recommended that the retarder enable switch, if present, be disabled
- 3To avoid loss of control, use a combination of downshifting, braking and other retarding devices. Downshifting to a lower transmission range increases engine braking and can help you maintain control. The transmission has a feature to prevent automatic upshifting above the lower range selected. However, during downhill operation, if engine-governed speed is exceeded in the lower range, the transmission will upshift to the next higher range to prevent engine damage. This will reduce engine braking and could cause a loss of control. Apply the vehicle brakes or other retarding device to prevent exceeding engine-governed speed in the lower range selected



WORK TRUCK SHOW 2020: PICK YOUR POWER

The special 20th anniversary Work Truck Show took place in Indianapolis this spring from March 4-6. This annual gathering is North America's largest assembly of vocational trucks and equipment. Classes 1-8 were all represented, including everything from chassis to accessories.

The Work Truck Show is one of the top 100 trade shows in the United States. Each year, it brings together people from many different backgrounds within the work truck industry. Truck OEMs, body and equipment manufacturers, dealers and distributors all contribute to the event.

This year, Freightliner's booth featured the debut of the MT50e all-electric chassis. To celebrate its reveal, a reception was held Wednesday evening with the experts behind its design. Visitors had a chance to chat with the designers and get insights on the chassis' production and applications.

The MT50e chassis is the only all-electric, zero-emission platform. Its powerful, efficient battery system from Proterra has an energy capacity of 226kWh and can charge completely in three hours. The chassis also has no reduction in cargo volume capacity.

Those who attended the Work Truck Show had the opportunity to see the new chassis for themselves. Guests got to "Pick their Power" and learn more about all of Freightliner's fuel options. In addition to all-electric, Freightliner chassis are also powered by diesel, gasoline, propane and CNG.



2020 BRANSON, MISSOURI RALLY

Save the date for a rally in Branson to be held from November 4-8, 2020. There will also be a Camp Freightliner scheduled after the rally from November 3-4, as well as our annual meeting. Be sure to check online at www.fcocrv.org for upcoming rally registrations.

NOTE: The Branson rally has been rescheduled to November 4-8, 2020 due to COVID-19.

The state of Missouri has implemented travel restrictions through May 15, which would have been the last day of the Branson rally. Thankfully, we were able to postpone the rally instead of cancelling it.

The Branson rally will now take place from November 4-8. Camp Freightliner will be taught on November 3 and 4, and those attending this class will need to arrive on November 2.

As a result, Freightliner will also be contacting those registered for the class to find out if you want to attend on the new dates or cancel. As a result of the changed dates, the rally's entertainment has also changed to a trip to Silver Dollar City (SDC). We will attend "A Christmas Carole" with reserved seating and a buffet meal in a private dining room at the park, and then stay to view light parade. The park is decorated with just under 7 million spectacular lights.

For those attending Camp Freightliner class who had a reservation at the campground for the original dates, Michelle from the campground will contact you to see if you want to change your reservation at the campground or cancel it.

Due to the long day, we will provide a round trip via the buses from the SDC park to the campground so those who have animals can take care of them. The park is about 5 miles from the campground.

Lastly, just for your information: We were in Branson exactly a year ago to scout this trip and the temperatures were right on the average of 62–64 during the day and 39–40 at night.

THINGS TO DO AND SEE IN BRANSON

HISTORIC DOWNTOWN BRANSON: A destination of its own, the walkable Historic Downtown district has a friendly atmosphere and is home to a variety of restaurants, retail shops, entertainment, outdoor activities and unique attractions. There's even a free trolley to get you around the district. (www.explorebranson.com/downtown)

BRANSON LANDING WATER & FIRE SHOW: Located along a scenic boardwalk, the fountains are at the heart of the town square and feature an awe-inspiring merging of water, fire, light and music. The choreographed spectacle is produced by the team behind world-class shows for Disney and the Bellagio in Las Vegas.

RUTH AND PAUL HENNING CONSERVATION AREA: Located 5.3 miles west of Route 65 on Branson's strip, this 1,534-acre area invites visitors to take a walk on one of several trails that draws visitors from all over the world. A 40-foot viewing tower can be found roughly a half-mile from the main parking lot. Trails are only open to foot traffic. (www.visitmo.com/things-to-do/ruth-and-paul-henning-conservation-area)

BRANSON FERRIS WHEEL: Formerly gracing Chicago's Navy Pier, the 150-foot-tall Ferris Wheel has quickly become one of Branson's most popular attractions, especially at night when it lights up with 16,000 LED lights. Ride one of the 40 gondolas to get (www.bransontracks.com/rides/ferris-wheel)

TABLE ROCK LAKE: In the half century since it opened, Table Rock Lake has grown from a reservoir developed out of a flood control project to a world-class paradise for watersports, fishing and just plain 'o relaxing. You'll find more than 800 miles of shoreline and over 43,000 miles of surface area for dropping lines for catfish and bass or pulling skiers and tubers. 

Ask the Right Questions



SLOW COOKER GRANOLA

Prep time: 15 min Cook time: 3 hours Servings: 20 (1/2 cup servings)

INGREDIENTS:

- 4 cups old-fashioned oats

1/2 cup coconut oil, melted

- 2 cups chopped nuts

- 1/2 cup honey

- 2 cups shredded coconut - 1 cup dried fruit

- 1/4 teaspoon salt

Make this recipe your own by adding cinnamon, nutmeg or your favorite spices. Try maple syrup instead of honey for a unique flavor – the ingredients are up to you!

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Coat a large slow cooker with nonstick cooking spray. Place the oats, nuts, coconut and salt in the slow cooker and stir to combine. Melt the coconut oil and pour it into the slow cooker along with the honey. Stir until the mixture is evenly coated.
- 2. Cover the slow cooker with the lid, leaving a 1- to 2-inch gap for airflow. Cook on high for 30 minutes, then remove lid and stir.
- Continue cooking, stirring well every 20 to 30 minutes until the granola is golden brown, for 2 to 2 1/2 hours. Adjust the heat as needed if the granola browns too quickly.
- 4. Remove the granola from the pot and spread into an even layer on a large, rimmed baking sheet. Allow the granola to cool completely. Stir in dried fruit if desired. Store in an airtight container.

Servings: 8

LOADED POTATO SALAD

Prep time: 30 min Cook time: 20 minutes

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 pounds red potatoes, quartered
- 1/2 pound bacon strips, chopped
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1/4 cup creamy Caesar salad dressing
- 1/4 cup ranch salad dressings
- 3 tablespoons sour cream
- 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
- 3 green onions, chopped
- 1/4 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- Pepper to taste

- Place potatoes in a large saucepan and cover them with water. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat, then cover and cook 15-20 minutes or until tender.
- 2. Meanwhile, cook bacon in a large skillet over medium heat, until crisp. Transfer to paper towels to cool. Drain the grease, reserving 3 tablespoons of the drippings.
- 3. Drain potatoes and place in a large bowl. Add bacon and reserved drippings then toss to coat. Refrigerate until chilled.
- Whisk the mayonnaise, dressings, sour cream and mustard in a small bowl. Pour over potato mixture and toss to coat. Stir in onions and cheese. Sprinkle with pepper if desired.

Add in your own onions or garlic to enhance the flavor of this dish!

My wife, Susan, and I have been "travelholics" all our adult lives. We have been all around the world-my hobby of underwater photography led me from the Philippine Sea off the West Coast of New Guinea through the South Pacific, the Galapagos Islands, to the Sinai and the Red Sea.
