# Get The Most From Your Allison-Equipped Motorhome

Allison Motorhome Series™ fully automatic transmissions provide customized performance at your fingertips. The transmission will automatically select gears based on engine rpm, throttle position, vehicle load and road speed. However, you can manually control the upshifts and downshifts when it is necessary for driving in different conditions. To avoid damage to the drivetrain, the transmission will not allow you to select a range that will over-speed the engine.



# Highway Driving (Level Terrain)

Operating in the Drive mode is recommended when driving in normal highway conditions.



# Mountainous Driving (Up & Down Terrain)

When ascending a grade, gently release pressure on the throttle and select a lower gear range to maintain higher engine rpm. Road speed may decrease, but power (torque) will remain at peak output. When descending a grade, never use a higher gear range than was used ascending the same grade. Selecting a lower gear range will also minimize cycling between ranges on a series of short up and down hills.



# City Driving (Stop & Go Traffic)<sup>1</sup>

To maximize performance select the lowest gear range that allows the vehicle to reach the speed you expect to attain between stops. This will minimize cycling between higher ranges and provide better vehicle cooling while driving in stop-and-go conditions.



# Winter Driving (Ice Or Snow)<sup>2</sup>

If possible, reduce road speed and select a lower gear range before you lose traction. Select the gear range that will not exceed the speed you expect to maintain. Accelerate or decelerate gradually to prevent losing traction. It is very important to gradually slow down when a lower gear range is selected. It is also important to allow the transmission to reach the lower gear range before attempting to accelerate. This will avoid an unexpected downshift during acceleration.



# Engine Braking<sup>3</sup>

Engine braking provides good speed control for going down grades. When the vehicle is heavily loaded or the grade is steep, it may be desirable to preselect a lower range reaching the grade. If engine-governed speed is exceeded, the transmission will upshift automatically to the next range.

- 1 In the event you leave the vehicle or driving compartment, even momentarily, while the engine is running, be sure the transmission is in Neutral and the parking brake and/or emergency brakes are set and properly engaged. Unexpected and possible sudden vehicle movement may occur if these precautions are not taken.
- 2 Using the retarder on wet or slippery roads may cause loss of traction on the drive wheels—your vehicle may slide out of control. To help avoid injury or property damage, turn the retarder enable to OFF when driving on wet or slippery roads. The retarder is automatically disabled whenever the vehicle anti-lock brake system (ABS) is active. However, in case the ABS malfunctions, it is recommended that the retarder enable switch, if present, be disabled.
- 3 To avoid loss of control, use a combination of downshifting, braking and other retarding devices. Downshifting to a lower transmission range increases engine braking and can help you maintain control. The transmission has a feature to prevent automatic upshifting above the lower range selected. However, during downhill operation, if engine-governed speed is exceeded in the lower range, the transmission will upshift to the next higher range to prevent engine damage. This will reduce engine braking and could cause a loss of control. Apply the vehicle brakes or other retarding device to prevent exceeding engine-governed speed in the lower range selected.





Save the date for a rally in Branson to be held from November 4-8, 2020. There will also be a Camp Freightliner scheduled after the rally from November 3-4, as well as our annual meeting. Be sure to check online at www.fcocrv.org for upcoming rally registrations.

**NOTE:** The Branson rally has been rescheduled to November 4-8, 2020 due to COVID-19.

The state of Missouri has implemented travel restrictions through May 15, which would have been the last day of the Branson rally. Thankfully, we were able to postpone the rally instead of cancelling it.

The Branson rally will now take place from November 4–8. Camp Freightliner will be taught on November 3 and 4, and those attending this class will need to arrive on November 2.

As a result, Freightliner will also be contacting those registered for the class to find out if you want to attend on the new dates or cancel. The rally's entertainment has also changed to a trip to Silver Dollar City (SDC). We will attend "A Christmas Carole" with reserved seating and a buffet meal in a private dining room at the park, and then stay to view light parade. The park is decorated with just under 7 million spectacular lights.

For those attending Camp Freightliner class who had a reservation at the campground for the original dates, Michelle from the campground will contact you to see if you want to change your reservation at the campground or cancel it.

Due to the long day, we will provide a round trip via the buses from the SDC park to the campground so those who have animals can take care of them. The park is about 5 miles from the campground.

Lastly, just for your information: We were in Branson exactly a year ago to scout this trip and the temperatures were right on the average of 62–64 during the day and 39–40 at night.







# THINGS TO DO AND SEE IN BRANSON

HISTORIC DOWNTOWN BRANSON: A destination of its own, the walkable Historic Downtown district has a friendly atmosphere and is home to a variety of restaurants, retail shops, entertainment, outdoor activities and unique attractions. There's even a free trolley to get you around the district. (www.explorebranson.com/downtown)


**BRANSON LANDING WATER & FIRE SHOW:** Located along a scenic boardwalk, the fountains are at the heart of the town square and feature an awe-inspiring merging of water, fire, light and music. The choreographed spectacle is produced by the team behind world-class shows for Disney and the Bellagio in Las Vegas. (www.bransonlanding.com/Fountains.html)

**RUTH AND PAUL HENNING CONSERVATION AREA:** Located 5.3 miles west of Route 65 on Branson's strip, this 1,534-acre area invites visitors to take a walk on one of several trails that draws visitors from all over the world. A 40-foot viewing tower can be found roughly a half-mile from the main parking lot. Trails are only open to foot traffic. (www.visitmo.com/things-to-do/ruth-and-paul-henning-conservation-area)

**BRANSON FERRIS WHEEL:** Formerly gracing Chicago's Navy Pier, the 150-foot-tall Ferris Wheel has quickly become one of Branson's most popular attractions, especially at night when it lights up with 16,000 LED lights. Ride one of the 40 gondolas to get the most spectacular views of Branson and the beautiful Ozark Mountains. (www.bransontracks.com/rides/ferris-wheel)

**TABLE ROCK LAKE:** In the half century since it opened, Table Rock Lake has grown from a reservoir developed out of a flood control project to a world-class paradise for watersports, fishing and just plain 'o relaxing. You'll find more than 800 miles of shoreline and over 43,000 miles of surface area for dropping lines for catfish and bass or pulling skiers and tubers. # **NEWMAR AND FCCC: REVOLUTIONARY DIESEL POWER**

# THE FRONT-ENGINE MC DIESEL CHASSIS

This spring, FCCC introduced a new chassis to its extensive line-up: the front-engine MC diesel chassis. This revolutionary motorhome chassis was a breakthrough in several ways – it was carefully constructed to outperform gas-powered Class A motorhomes with better torque, increased fuel efficiency, quieter and smoother handling and maximum towing capacity.

The 2021 Canyon Star by Newmar is the first motorhome to ride on the Freightliner Custom Chassis frontengine MC diesel chassis. For the past 15 years, the Canyon Star has operated on a gas-powered chassis, with all of Newmar's high standards for amenities and advanced technology.

This upgrade to the Canyon Star will transform it into a quieter, less expensive and more powerful motorhome. These changes are all possible because of the chassis' innovative diesel engine technology.

Misconceptions about diesel engines have existed for decades – many people previously thought of diesel as the expensive, dirty and inefficient fuel option. In fact, these misconceptions are actually the opposite of the truth about modern diesel engines.

# **FUEL EFFICIENCY**

Diesel engines are now the most efficient engines in the industry. In comparison to other similar-size gasoline, propane or compressed natural gas engines, diesel provides up to 50% better fuel economy.

This factor will allow RV owners to travel farther without stopping to refuel, and to spend less on fuel overall. The new front-engine MC diesel chassis features 10-11 mpg, whereas gas chassis typically range from 6-6.5 mpg.

Although both types of chassis have the same 80-gallon fuel tank, the MC has an 880-mile range on one tank of diesel, while a tank of gasoline has a range of roughly 520 miles. These advantages over gasoline power make the diesel engine the most cost-effective option in the industry.\*

# Front-engine Diesel Advantages vs Gasoline:

- Greater engine torque and fuel efficiency
- Lower engine position for flat floor and no doghouse between driver and passenger
- Commercial air brakes-improved stopping power & lower maintenance costs
- Diesel generator
- Quieter engine noise on the highway
- Greater towing ability
- Better longevity and value retention

# **CLEAN POWER**

The front-engine MC diesel chassis runs with a Cummins B6.7 engine, with 340 hp and 700 ft-lb of torque. This setup allows the coach to also run more quietly, and gives the chassis a lifespan that's three to five times longer than traditional gasoline-powered chassis.

The MC chassis also boasts much longer mileage intervals between oil changes – the MC only requires an oil change every 15,000 miles, compared to 5,000 miles for gas chassis. On top of that, the life expectancy of the brakes for the MC chassis is between 100,000-150,000 miles, while brakes on gas-powered chassis are only expected to last between 12,000-15,000 miles.\*

These features give the completely redesigned Canyon Star the ultimate ease of maneuverability and superior ride quality. Plus, diesel is one of the cleanest fuels available in the industry. Diesel emissions are now more than 90% cleaner than they were in 2006. This means that diesel engines often have the smallest carbon footprint over the life of the RV, compared to propane or gasoline.

# **OTHER ADVANCEMENTS**

This major overhaul to the Canyon Star's foundation was not the only change it underwent this year. The 2021 Canyon Star will be available in nine different floorplans, ranging from 35 to 39 feet long.

Its exterior features new front and rear caps, plus a streamlined design. Inside, the upgrades include an entirely redesigned cockpit and instrument panel including a larger radio and monitor system. This new setup also introduces redesigned cabinet doors and drawers, a feature ceiling and new furniture options.

The new MC chassis also includes even more new benefits, like its 30,000-pound GVWR and tow hitch rated at 6,000 pounds.

All of these exciting changes from the front-engine MC diesel chassis represent a breakthrough within the RV industry – diesel power is breaking barriers, shattering old misconceptions and transforming the future of RVs.

# Stay Safe Under the Sun

No matter what activities you like to do outside of your RV, sun protection should always be a priority. Unprotected exposure to the sun can lead to long-term skin damage and negative effects on your health – consequences which no one would enjoy.

Sun protection is important all year long, but especially during the summer when our skin is often more exposed to the sunlight and its impact is much more intense. If you can form the habit of creating a sun protection routine, it will easily morph into your daily RV life so you can enjoy plenty of outdoor activities.

- Purchase sunscreen which protects against UVA and UVB rays

# **Look Back on Summer Memories**



- 4 small yellow summer squash, sliced
- 1 cup bread crumbs

- 1 clove garlic, minced

- ¼ lemon, zested and juiced
- 1 tbsp tomato paste
- 1/2 tsp onion salt

- 1/2 tsp white sugar




