Many of the other Freightliner locations will also honor this discount, but you need to ask upfront. Both require YOU to ask about the discount when you schedule your service and show them a current membership card.

Chrysler also offers a discount program that allows you to buy a car or truck at a special discount because of your FCOC membership. If you want purchase a new vehicle, be sure to send me an email requesting the information, and make sure you have put your membership number in your email. I wanted to remind everyone to use their 24/7 app when looking for a Freightliner dealer for service. The app will provide you with the phone number for the FCCC support line (1-800-FTL-HELP), which is always great for assistance 24 hours a day, or to help you look for a dealer in your area.

FCCC has been making great headway in getting dealers to become
Oasis Service Centers. The RV Soul publication provides a list of
current Oasis dealers in the back of the magazine. However, new
Oasis dealerships are certified frequently and may not yet be listed
in the magazine. The last issue added an additional page of Oasis dealerships
as we continue to update our information. You will notice some name changes to existing Oasis
dealers and a bunch of additional dealers have been added to the system.

The 24/7 app provides the latest information on oasis dealerships and their contact information.

Oasis dealers provide RV owners with special amenities not available at other Freightliner dealerships. Separate waiting areas, specially trained technicians and electric hookups are the minimum requirements to be an Oasis Service Center. Some provide a discount to FCOC members (be sure to ask BEFORE your service begins), pet areas, local stock of FCCC parts or overnight delivery of many specialized parts, access to FCCC factory drawings and technical information. Some Oasis dealers even provide full hookups.

Next time your RV needs a service, remember to search using the 24/7 app!



Get The Most From Your Allison-Equipped Motorhome

Allison Motorhome Series™ fully automatic transmissions provide customized performance at your fingertips. The transmission will automatically select gears based on engine rpm, throttle position, vehicle load and road speed. However, you can manually control the upshifts and downshifts when it is necessary for driving in different conditions. To avoid damage to the drivetrain, the transmission will not allow you to select a range that will over-speed the engine.



Highway Driving (Level Terrain)

Operating in the Drive mode is recommended when driving in normal highway conditions.



Mountainous Driving (Up & Down Terrain)

When ascending a grade, gently release pressure on the throttle and select a lower gear range to maintain higher engine rpm. Road speed may decrease, but power (torque) will remain at peak output. When descending a grade, never use a higher gear range than was used ascending the same grade. Selecting a lower gear range will also minimize cycling between ranges on a series of short up and down hills.



City Driving (Stop & Go Traffic)¹

To maximize performance select the lowest gear range that allows the vehicle to reach the speed you expect to attain between stops. This will minimize cycling between higher ranges and provide better vehicle cooling while driving in stop-and-go conditions.



Winter Driving (Ice Or Snow)²

If possible, reduce road speed and select a lower gear range before you lose traction. Select the gear range that will not exceed the speed you expect to maintain. Accelerate or decelerate gradually to prevent losing traction. It is very important to gradually slow down when a lower gear range is selected. It is also important to allow the transmission to reach the lower gear range before attempting to accelerate. This will avoid an unexpected downshift during acceleration.



Engine Braking³

Engine braking provides good speed control for going down grades. When the vehicle is heavily loaded or the grade is steep, it may be desirable to preselect a lower range reaching the grade. If engine-governed speed is exceeded, the transmission will upshift automatically to the next range.

- 1 In the event you leave the vehicle or driving compartment, even momentarily, while the engine is running, be sure the transmission is in Neutral and the parking brake and/or emergency brakes are set and properly engaged. Unexpected and possible sudden vehicle movement may occur if these precautions are not taken.
- 2 Using the retarder on wet or slippery roads may cause loss of traction on the drive wheels—your vehicle may slide out of control. To help avoid injury or property damage, turn the retarder enable to OFF when driving on wet or slippery roads. The retarder is automatically disabled whenever the vehicle anti-lock brake system (ABS) is active. However, in case the ABS malfunctions, it is recommended that the retarder enable switch, if present, be disabled.
- 3 To avoid loss of control, use a combination of downshifting, braking and other retarding devices. Downshifting to a lower transmission range increases engine braking and can help you maintain control. The transmission has a feature to prevent automatic upshifting above the lower range selected. However, during downhill operation, if engine-governed speed is exceeded in the lower range, the transmission will upshift to the next higher range to prevent engine damage. This will reduce engine braking and could cause a loss of control. Apply the vehicle brakes or other retarding device to prevent exceeding engine-governed speed in the lower range selected.





HOW TO PLAN YOUR FULL-TIME RV ROUTE FOR 2021

The cold, cozy months of winter are the ideal time to plan ahead for your road trip adventures next year. If you want to hit the road full-time, it's especially important to begin preparing as soon as possible.

Although much of the thrill of full-time RVing comes from spontaneity and flexibility, planning certain details in advance can make your trips much smoother and less stressful.

DEDICATE TIME FOR PLANNING

Blocking out a time in your calendar can help solidify your RV dreams. Set aside a weekend or a few evenings during the week to get started on your full-time RV lifestyle plans.

After scheduling a time on your own calendar and coordinating with anyone else who will be part of the process, you'll need to gather some essential resources. Every person's preferred planning method will vary, but we recommend starting with the following tools:

- A dedicated planning notebook
- A digital spreadsheet
- A hard copy of a US map
- A National Park guide (and/or State Park guide)

Digital spreadsheets are much easier to edit than hard copies of plans, but, printed versions can also follow you wherever you go, regardless of internet access. Keep this in mind when choosing your planning materials.

The first step in planning is one of the most enjoyable parts—deciding where you want to go. Pull out your US map and begin by circling the destinations that you do not want to miss. After competing this part of the process, mapping your route becomes much easier, and you can begin deciding how much time you want to spend at each destination.





CREATE BACKUP PLANS

As much as we all want our travels to go exactly as planned, this isn't always the case. But, it is no reason to feel discouraged. Creating a backup plan can help eliminate stress in between destinations, and help you get the most out of your full-time RV lifestyle.

While you might prefer to have every day accounted for in your calendar, we suggest adding some cushion and accounting for potential hiccups between destinations.

For example, if you book a reservation from Thursday through Sunday, leave your calendar open for Monday and Tuesday before traveling to your next stop. If you fall in love with one campground and want to stay longer, this gives you extra time to do just that. And, if you run into an unplanned RV repair, this window of time might be just what you need to fix your coach before returning to the road.

In addition to adding some wiggle room to your calendar, it's also beneficial to create backup plans for campgrounds. By booking at least six months in advance, you can usually avoid being turned away because of no availability. This is important to consider at all campgrounds, but especially popular destinations like Denver and Yosemite.

Searching for backup campgrounds near your destination will help when you can't make a reservation far enough in advance, or if your preferred campground unexpectedly meets their capacity.

DOUBLE-CHECK THE DETAILS

Double-check all of your plans before deciding you're ready to leave. Here are some important questions to consider:

- What is the cancellation policy of each park/campground?
- Can you access the details of your destinations offline?
 - Address, phone number, reservation date, site number, check-in and checkout times, full hookups or not, confirmation numbers
- Can you access your complete route offline? Do you have a hard copy?
- What nearby locations offer boondocking?

While the planning phase is necessary for full-time RV travels, it's also important not to get hung up if you miss a stop along the way or have to stray from your schedule. Flexibility and an open mindset are two road trip essentials you should always bring along for the ride.

ROADSIDE IRICITES

COCONUT CLUSTERS

Prep time: 10 min Cook time: 12 minutes Servings: 24

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 1/2 cups coconut flakes
- 3/4 cup pumpkin seeds
- 1/4 cup chia seeds
- 1/4 cup real maple syrup
- Add in chocolate chips if desired

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°F and line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Add all the ingredients to a large bowl and combine well.
- 3. Use two teaspoons to form the rounded clusters and drop onto the baking sheet.
- 4. Bake for 12 to 15 minutes, until the coconut just begins to turn a golden color.
- 5. Allow the clusters to cool for at least 30 minutes. (Note: if liquid from the syrup spreads out onto the baking sheet, try to push it back toward the clusters. This holds them together once they are cool.)

INGREDIENTS:

- 4 cups flour
- 1 cup light brown sugar, lightly packed
- 1 cup molasses
- 1 cup vegetable shortening
- 1 tbsp baking soda
- 1 egg, lightly beaten

- 1/4 tsp salt
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1/4 cup water
- 1 tbsp ground ginger
- 1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp ground cloves

SOFT GINGERBREAD COOKIES

Prep time: 15 min Cook time: 10 minutes Servings: 46 cookies

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Add molasses, brown sugar and shortening to a medium saucepan and melt the mixture over medium-low heat, just until smooth. Remove from heat and stir in the baking soda and water. Let it cool to room temperature.
- 2. Once cooled, mix in the egg, salt, baking powder, ginger, cinnamon and cloves until combined. Add in the 4 cups of flour and mix well (add up to 1/2 cup more flour if the dough seems sticky.) Shape into a ball and cover in plastic wrap, then refrigerate for at least 2 hours (up to 24 hours).
- 3. Preheat the oven to 350°F and line baking sheets with parchment paper.
- Shape the dough into balls and place on cookie sheets 2 inches apart. Do not flatten.
- 5. Bake for 10-12 minutes, or until risen and no longer shiny. Set the cookie sheets on a wire rack to cool for a few minutes, then transfer cookies to the racks to cool completely.

Our goal now is to go back and see other areas that we may have missed. We want to head up to New England, New York and a few other places as we have seen, but haven't stopped at their most unique attractions.




