

And of course, our factory-direct phone support is always just a click away.

- 1. Locate a dealer. This will let find the closest dealer to your present location, or you can put in any city and it will tell you all the local dealers in that area.
- 2. 1-800-FTL-HELP. This will connect you to the Freightliner Custom Chassis HOTLINE.

President James Peek spoke on the value and benefits of the Freightliner 24/7 Direct application. He reinforced that all members should download on their phones for any questions/information and importance to always use your FCOC #.

Oasis dealers and Overland Insurance information are in the RV Soul, not all of the Oasis dealers offer discounts so be sure to call ahead before you go. Overland Insurance offers great rates call for a quote.

VP Area Operations-West Steve Jenneret, Rallies: we try to hold 4 national rallies per year as welt as a few area rallies, national rallies are larger 100 RV rallies, area rallies are smaller more personal rallies that consist of 20-25 RV's, this is where we need everybody's help, if you know of any RV park that can hold 100 RVs with full hook up sites with 50 amps plus a meeting room that can hold 200 people, we are also looking to hold rallies at the fairgrounds, which require that we carry 1 ML liability insurance, if anyone has insurance knowledge or if you know anyone we can call please let us know that as well. We are always looking for Rally Masters and Assistant Rally Masters, benefits are that you are reimbursed for your fuel to and from the rally as well as your rally fee.

VP Business Development Steve Bertling: Steve reported that his main job is to get advertising and sponsors for the RV Soul and to keep all information updated. Steve also shared that he is currently working on trying to getting Michelin Tires to set up a program through FCOC.

Editor Cindy Feindel: Cindy shared that she would like to see if we can make the magazine more about us. Let's try to make it OUR Magazine, make it all about us. Treasure Tom Bernardi: Tom gave the treasurers report. The Club is in very good financial condition. Membership income is growing, we have 10,000 members,

5,000 coaches, net income for the last 4 yrs has been more than \$30,000. Equity grown went from \$120,000 to \$269,000 at the end of 2021. Current net assets minus liabilities went from \$217,000 to \$373,000, plus \$108,000 differed income. Financial reports are not published, if any member would like to go over the statements, contact Tom.

Tom spoke on how important it is that each member to go on the website and update their profile with current contact information such as mailing address and emails. Contact information for officers is on the website under "home" then "contacts," as well as listed in the magazine, if you have any questions.

**Roy Hopper Sr. Vice President:** Discussed the importance of the club to obtain the Million-dollar liability coverage that is now a requirement for most RV camp grounds and Fairgrounds. If you have any information on that please let us know. Also, this will be the last rally that we will be offering alcohol at our rallies; from now on it will be BYOB and we will still serve sodas and water. Roy shared that we need to put together a nominating committee, which consist of 5 members. Roy will serve on the committee and will need 4 additional members to volunteer; committee members will communicate by phone. Give Roy a call for all the details.

# A LETTER FR. MSR. JP

Just a note to let you know some general information about Freightliner Chassis Owners Club. I was elected Senior Vice President at our annual business meeting in Amana, Iowa. One of my most important responsibilities is to find RV parks that are suitable for us to hold rallies.

We hold two types of rallies. The first are national rallies where we usually have around 100 coaches. It is at these rallies that we hold educational seminars where speakers from Allison Transmission, Michelin Tire, and Cummins talk about their products. It is also at these rallies that we usually have the famous Camp Freightliner class that teaches practically everything you need to know about your chassis. In addition to the class, the Freightliner instructor also gives a presentation to the entire group, and he entertains a question and answer session. We also offer additional seminars covering such topics as fire safety, weight and tire safety, holding tank sanitation, and medical transport insurance. In the future, we also are planning on offering sessions covering topics such as becoming a full timer, work camping on the road, and traveling on a budget. During these rallies we also offer craft sessions for those who don't want to attend the seminars, and we are available to give recommendations for things to do away from the rally site in the local area. We also have games and entertainment in the evening.

The second type of rally that we do is the area rally. At these, we usually have around 25 coaches. These are less formal in that educational seminars aren't usually given. These rallies are more for fun in that the group has more time to explore the local attractions. Round table discussion may be done where the members can discuss coach/camping issues and solutions with each other. Games and entertainment are also offered during these rallies. They can be held in smaller communities and parks.

As you are all aware, Freightliner Chassis Owners Club is a volunteer organization where we have no paid employees. This is where we need your help. We would like suggestions on parks where we can hold both national and area rallies. You all travel around the country, so who better than you to recommend parks that would be suitable for one of our rallies? The main requirements are that for a national rally we need a park that can provide 100 full hookup sites with 50 amp service. We also require a meeting room that will accommodate 200 people. These are getting harder to find and that is where we really need your help. We are in the process of obtaining insurance where we will be able to start holding rallies at fairgrounds, so that will make our job a little easier. Requirements for area rallies aren't as stringent. We simply need a park that can handle around 25 coaches for a rally, with a meeting room that will accommodate approximately



50 people. Hopefully, these parks will be in areas where there are enough interesting attractions to keep the group busy for two or three days.

I have one more favor to ask of the membership. In addition to finding locations for rallies, we are almost always in the need of rally masters and assistant rally masters. These are positions that are extremely rewarding. You get to plan and organize the activities of the rally with the help of the FCOC board. It can be challenging and sometimes a bit timeconsuming, but rest assured everyone on the board is willing to help. All you have to do is ask. Additionally, an added bonus is that you attend the rally for free and the cost of your diesel fuel is reimbursed by the club.

Our goal is to hold up to four national rallies per year. We will hold as many area rallies as possible as well. Of course, this is dependent on finding suitable locations and volunteers to conduct them. Won't you please help us make this happen?

If you have information on possible sites for area rallies, please contact one of your area vice presidents. Contact the East VP for sites east of the Mississippi River and the West VP for rally sites west of the river. For national rally sites please contact the Senior VP with information, or if you would like to discuss being a rally or assistant rally master, contact me as well. #### THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN YUMA!

The list is endless of the things you can see and do in Yuma, and you are only about 22 miles from the Algondones, Mexico border.

#### TOP 12 THINGS TO PUT ON YOUR MUST SEE LIST ARE:

**SANGUINETTI HOUSE MUSEUM & GARDENS:** Coming to Yuma penniless at age 15, E. F. Sanguinetti (1867-1946) built a business empire as a farmer, merchant, and banker. His charming home and gardens were donated by his family to the Arizona Historical Society as a fitting testament to his legacy. Experience the turn of the century life in Yuma at this quaint museum. Also see the Medal of Honor exhibit. Free Admission to Veterans!

**THE 3:10 TO YUMA STOPS HERE:** Yuma Territorial Prison State Historic Park. On July 1, 1876, the first seven inmates entered the Territorial Prison at Yuma and were locked into the new cells they had built themselves. Thus began the legend of the Yuma Territorial Prison. A total of 3, 069 prisoners, including 29 women, lived within the walls during the prison's 33 years of operation. YUMA QUARTERMASTER DEPOT STATE HISTORIC PARK: Experience the story of the Colorado River–Lifeblood of the Southwest. Once wild and uncontrollable, the Colo-rado River is now the most dammed river in the world–a river that slows to a trickle at the Mexican boarder, just 20 miles from Yuma. How did this happen? You will see "Where Does the Water Go" Exhibit in Visitor Information Center.Learn the uses of the Colorado River from Hover Dam to the Mexican border. **YUMA CROSSING:** Discover for yourself why the Yuma Crossing remains a national treasure. Two beautiful riverfront parks along the Colorado River; Seven miles of waterside bike trails; 400 acres of restored wetlands, with a 3-mile hiking trail; two state historic parks within the National Historic Landmark; Steam locomotive and Ghost Train at Pivot Point Interpretive Plaza.

**THE PEANUT PATCH:** A rich tradition in Yuma and the Southwest. Tours include history of the Peanut Patch, how peanuts are grown and the many uses of peanuts. You can watch peanuts turn into peanut butter, with free tastes included. Also, you can pick up some of their homemade fudge & candies.

**WALLS OF WONDER:** A ginormous and colorful triptych of a desert scene spread across three huge water tanks that tower above I-8 (at 16th Street) "GHOSTTRAIN" - SOUND & LIGHT SHOW: "Ghost Train" at Pivot Point Interpretive Plaza, on Madison Avenue at the Colorado River, is a unique "sound and light: show with laser beams that trace the path of the first rail bridge across the Colorado River as the sound of a steam train's arrival echoes from speakers. Also, see a 1907 steam locomotive kids of all ages can admire and also clamber over.

**ART IN MOTION:** A mix of old and new shines forth at the Yuma Art Center and adjacent Historic Yuma Theatre, 254 S. Main St. The Center hosts rotating exhibits in spectacular gallery spaces plus several outdoor art events, including evening Art Walks (November to May).

"THE CITY OF YUMA": On August 24, 1949 pilots Bob Woodhouse and Woody Jongeward set out to break the endurance record for continuous flight–1008 hours–in a single-engine airplane. Their airplane was "The City of Yuma" and their goal–1010 hours or "Ten-Ten" which became the nickname for the refueling car, a 1948 Buick convertible. You can see the whole story of "The City of Yuma" and a replica of the "Ten-Ten" at Yuma City Hall, One City Plaza.

**SCENE IN THE CITY:** On Main Street, you'll find interesting public art, including a GIANT FORK that's near but not literally in the road. Don't miss a new piece of street wall art entitled "Manna" behind the Main Street shops next to the Yuma Art Center.

MARTHA'S DATE GARDENS: Tour the date gardens, hear the history of the medjool date, see how the dates are cultivated and processed and enjoy their famous date shakes.

ARMED FORCES PARK: The only park of its type in Arizona, it has been designed to honor all military veterans–living or deceased, from all branches of service. Each honoree is recognized by an engraved granite plaque through sponsorship.

**FORTUNA DE ORO RV RESORT GOLF COURSE:** Par 36, 9 holes, 3,240 yard course complete with driving range, putting green, restaurant and Pro Shop.

#### EASY STUFFING RECIPE

PREP TIME: 20 MIN

COOK TIME: 10 MIN

salt to taste

12 cups bread cubes

3-4 cups chicken broth

2 tablespoons fresh parsley

1 tablespoon fresh herbs

sage, thyme, rosemary

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 2 small onions diced
- 4 ribs celery diced
- ⅔ cup butter
- 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoons poultry seasoning or 1/2 teaspoon ground sage
- black pepper

#### DIRECTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 350°F. 1.
- Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Add onion, celery and poultry seasoning (and rosemary if using). Cook over 2. medium-low until tender (do not brown), about 10-12 minutes.
- Place bread cubes in a large bowl. Add onion mixture, parsley and fresh herbs. 3.
- Pour broth overtop until cubes are moist (but not soggy) and gently toss. You may not need all of the broth. Season with salt and 4. pepper to taste.
- 5. Place mixture in a serving dish, dot with additional butter and cover.
- Bake 35 minutes, uncover and bake an additional 10 minutes. 6.

#### NOTES

- If using rosemary in the herbs, cook along with the onions/celery. To stuff turkey, stuffing must be cooled completely in the 1. refrigerator at least 45 minutes.
- To Make Ahead: Prepare as directed, cover tightly and refrigerate up to 48 hours. To bake, remove from the fridge at least 2. 30 minutes before baking. Prepare as directed (you may need to add a few minutes extra if it's still cold from the fridge).

We began motor homing in 2014 after retirement. We joined a couple of clubs for weekends in Illinois and to make new friends.

We like Michigan, and the mountains and national parks of the west, and Alaska, and have touched all 50 (most in our motorhome trips).

One of our most exciting motorhome trips was going to Alaska in 2017. We had been on a cruise the summer of 2012, but we knew it would be very different if we drove up in the motor home to see more and talk to people who actually live there. At Palmer in August 2017, we had one very exciting experience when hiking up Moose Mountain and encountered a moose in the wild. As we were coming down the trail we passed a young couple going 'pell-mell' up the trail. We cordially spoke to them and asked if they saw any moose. She said, "yes" there was one a little way ahead of us. I said, "I hope it did not have a baby with it." She said, "It is a baby," and disappeared up the trail. I thought how could there be a baby without a mother? In any case, not far off the trail, we soon spotted a moose eating in the bushes. We watched and decided that it would be best to discourage it from getting closer, so Jim waved his arms and took off his hat and made loud noises to attempt to scare it back. Then we high-tailed it down the trail toward the trailhead.

Very soon, we heard a sound and turned around to see this moose easily approaching with huge strides. We turned to face this moose that stopped in its tracks when Jim again took off his hat and waved it high in the air he made some loud deep whooping sounds. It turned around slowly and I noticed that the hair on its neck was not standing on end like you would see with an animal ready to attack. When we reached the trailhead, we felt so relieved, because there were no trees big enough in that part of the trail that we could have hidden behind. 

We have also used our Tiffin Phaeton at Pawnee, Illinois, and volunteered several days at Midwest Mission Distribution Center. We have helped pack flood buckets, school bags, hygiene kits, etc.

We enjoy spending time with FCOC people from all around the USA to fellowship with and to have a chance to learn from them and the experts brought to the rallies. Also, we feel so very privileged to be able to travel in our Phaeton to areas of so much beauty. We can more and more see the awesome beauty God has made for us to enjoy in the land and in the people we meet.


