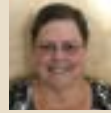

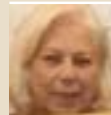

Adventures in Apache Junction

On our way home from Apache Junction, Arizona strong winds were pushing us along. Kenny (my husband and driver) had the comfort steering dialed in but was still fighting the wind. We were on Interstate 40 West approximately 120 miles west of Albuquerque, New Mexico. Opening the door, we saw awning brackets sticking out, wires flying in the wind and, upon further inspection, awning material flapping on top of our motorhome. The wind had blown our CLOSED main awning completely off of our coach. We realized that we needed to get to a safer place off the Interstate in order to assess the damage further. So, Kenny moved the coach about a quarter mile down the road into a gravel median.

Now we were in a safe spot and went outside to view the damage. I was the last one out of the coach, of course. The wind was so strong, when I stepped out of the RV, the door slammed behind me. Hard. I didn't give it a thought, as my concern was inspecting the coach and helping Kenny with whatever was needed. Kenny immediately climbed the ladder to the top of the coach to see how much damage was done to the top of our motorhome. The awning roller was nowhere to be found. Where it went, no one knows! We didn't hear any screeching brakes or hollering, our prayer was that it went straight up and landed somewhere in a field. To his relief nothing else was damaged, just some minor scratches where the awning had been attached. After walking around holding onto anything and everything, including my hair, I headed back to the coach to get my phone. When I tried to open the door...it was locked! Well, like the dummies that we are, we had talked about the need to change the combination for the outside door lock to something that we could remember... BUT, did we??? NOPE. The previous owner's passcode was, you guessed it, inside on my phone, with the cat! The extra set of RV keys were...locked in the tow Jeep, and the Jeep keys were locked in the coach! What a dilemma!

Luckily a small window had been left open for air, so the idea was for Kenny to boost me up, break the screen and get in that way to gain access. Well, I am not as small as I used to be, didn't feel well, was weak with no strength in my legs and the wind was blowing, what we found out later, gusts of up to 75 mph! Can you picture this?! Needless to say, this plan did not work. Kenny was in the process of climbing back up on the roof to inspect things

further, when out of nowhere two gentlemen in a white van pulled up into the median. The driver of the van asked me "Are you in trouble?" My reply was, "We're screwed! We lost our big awning in the wind and we're locked out of our rig." His reply was "I am a locksmith."

All I can say is that this had to be "Divine Intervention." What are the odds of a locksmith showing up in the middle of nowhere in the New Mexico desert? He and his son soon got the rig unlocked and I scurried in and stayed put! They stayed and helped Kenny take all of the broken hardware and the material off of the coach. 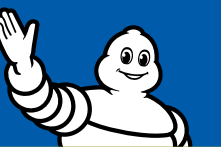

ROADSIDE RECIPES

INSTANT POT LOADED POTATO SOUP

Prep time: 15 min Cook time: 18 minutes Servings: 6

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 Tablespoon butter
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 3 cups chicken broth
- 1 can/box cream of chicken soup
- 7-8 medium sized russet potatoes
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- black pepper to taste
- 1 cup milk
- 1 tablespoon flour
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese

GARNISH:

- 5-6 slices bacon
- sliced green onions
- shredded cheddar cheese

DIRECTIONS:

1. Add butter to the Instant Pot and turn on the sauté button. Once butter is melted, add in the onions and cook for 3-4 minutes until soft. Add in the garlic and cook for one additional minute until fragrant, stirring constantly so that garlic does not burn.
2. Add the chicken broth, cream of chicken soup, potatoes, salt, and pepper to the pot, and stir well. Place the lid on the Instant Pot and turn the vent valve to "sealing." Cook over manual high pressure for 10 minutes, then quick release the pressure.
3. Meanwhile, stir together the milk and flour in a small bowl to create a slurry. Set aside.
4. Once the steam has completely released and the pin has dropped on the lid, open the lid and stir in the slurry. Turn the pot to sauté and cook the soup for 4-5 minutes, until thickened. Stir in the 2 cups of cheddar cheese and stir until melted. Serve garnished with chopped bacon, green onions, and more cheese. Enjoy!

INSTANT POT FRENCH TOAST

INGREDIENTS:

- 4 cups of French bread
- 3 eggs
- 3/4 cup milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon

DIRECTIONS:

1. To prepare the bread cut the loaf into slices and then cut into bite-size pieces and let it dry overnight on a cookie sheet or pan.
2. Select an ovenproof dish that fits inside your Instant Pot. Spray the bottom and sides of the dish with nonstick baking spray. You can use parchment paper in the bottom too for easy release. (you can use the special pan made for IP too if you have it).
3. In a large bowl whisk the eggs and then add the milk, vanilla, regular sugar, brown sugar, and cinnamon.
4. Add the dried bread pieces and push them down gently so that all the bread pieces are covered with the liquid. Let them soak for about 10 minutes. Stirring occasionally to make sure every piece of bread gets into the milk mixture.
5. Dump the mixture into your prepared dish. Cover the dish really well with foil. I put a piece over the top and then also placed the dish on a piece of foil and brought the edges up around it. (This helps seal out the moisture while it is steaming)
6. Place your trivet that came with the Instant Pot in the bottom of the pot and pour 1 cup of water into the pot.
7. Place your baking dish on top of the trivet.
8. Place the lid on the instant pot and make sure the vent is turned to “seal”. Set manual and pressure to high for 40 minutes.
9. When the timer goes off cover the vent with a towel and quick release the steam.
10. Remove the dish carefully as it will be hot and remove the foil from the dish draining off any excess moisture on the foil.
11. Let the dish sit for 10 minutes before serving.

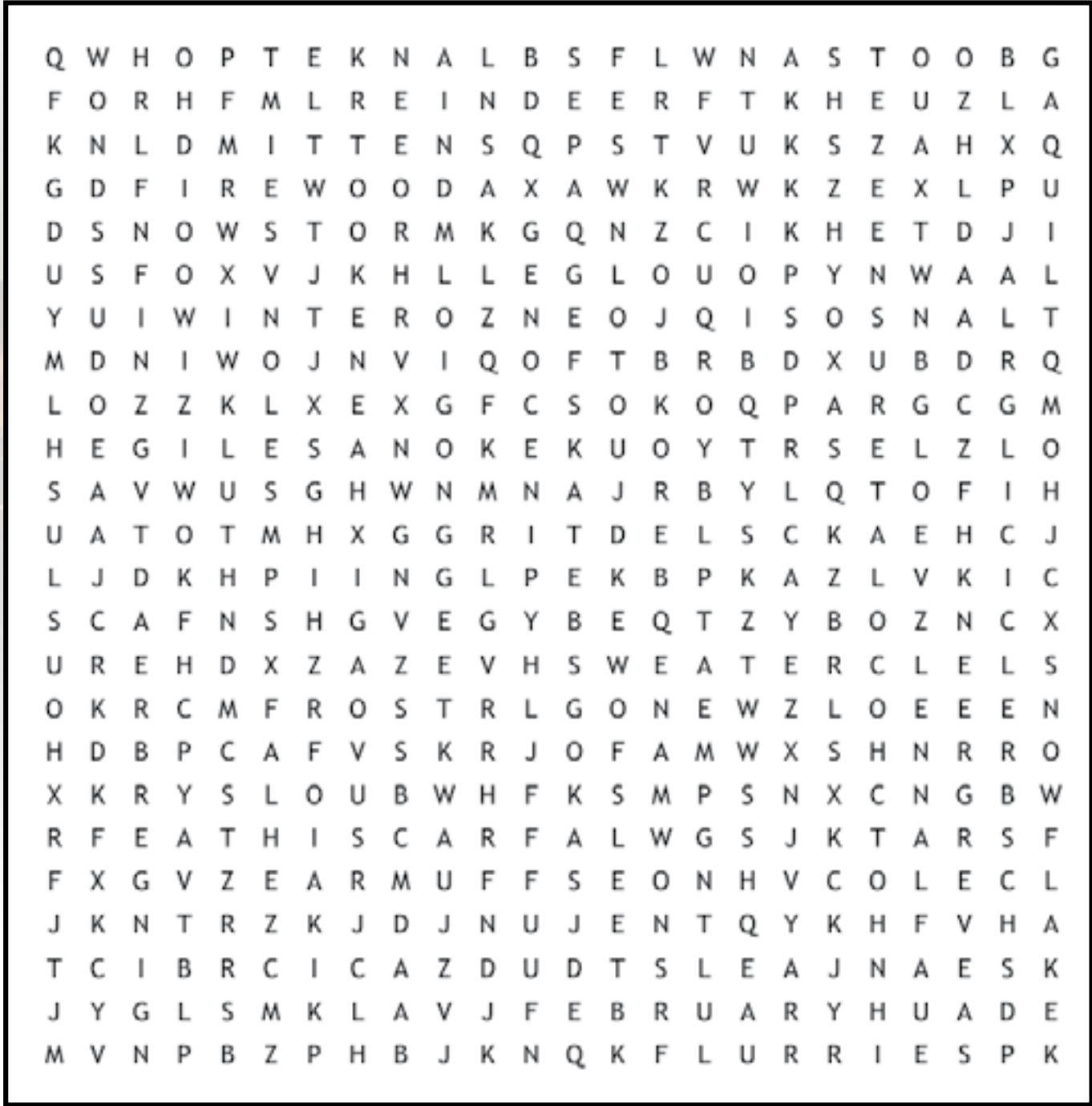

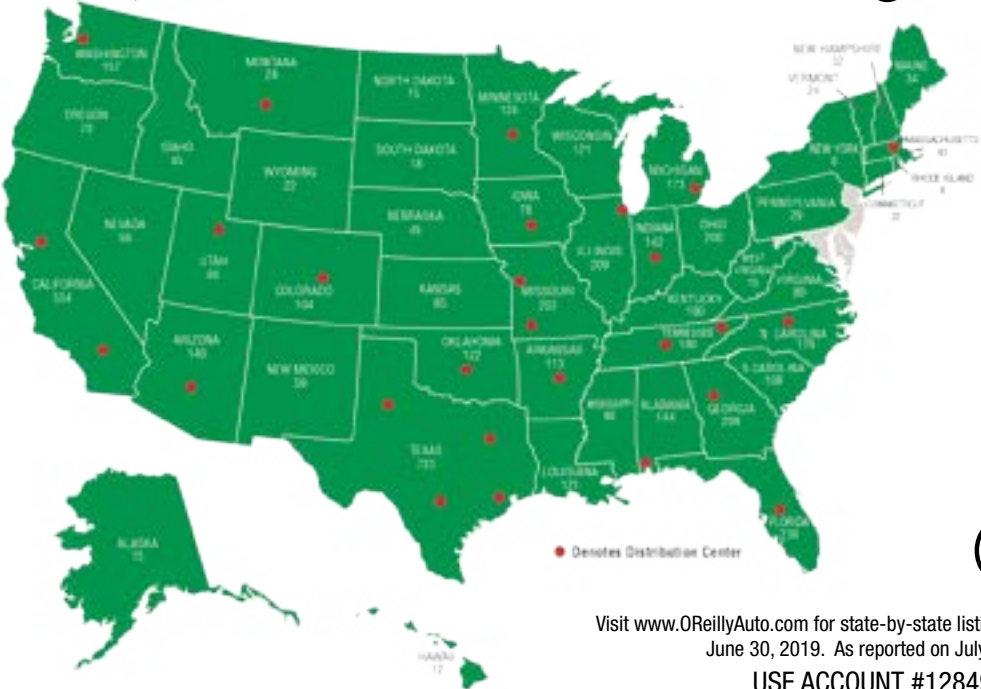
