## FCOCPRESIDENT'S MINISTER MINISTER



#### Welcome to Spring!

By the time you read this, we will have held our Super Event in Yuma. This was a combination effort of the FCOC, the Fleetwood Motorhome Association and the Diesel RV Club. Look for a recap of the event in the summer issue.

The advent of spring has brought a lot of questions from our members regarding service and training offered at our events as well as at Camp Freightliner. I thought I would take this opportunity to provide answers to some of the common questions I receive.

Our club has several thousand members. We try to provide access to education and fellowship through our events in as many areas of the country as possible to minimize the distance members must travel. Generally, that means at least two events east of the Mississippi River and two events on the west side each year. While I do recommend our members visit the customer service center in Gaffney, SC, for service and/or training, it is certainly a lengthy journey for most members.

Our relationship with Freightliner Custom Chassis Corporation (FCCC) is such that they offer the Camp Freightliner classes, as a courtesy, in conjunction with our four national events. At the Yuma event we hosted the first ever Camp Freightliner for the S2RV Super C chassis presented outside the factory service center (and there's only been one of those). No other organization enjoys the same level of support from FCCC. The diesel pusher class is distinctly different from the S2RV class. Be sure to sign up for the correct class for your chassis. The Camp Freightliner is wholly owned and operated by FCCC. Booking for the class is handled through their website.

It is a long way to Gaffney, SC, for many members. Consequently, the Camp Freightliner is a major attraction for our events. When taking a Camp Freightliner at one of our events, you will need to sign up for that class in addition to signing up for the event itself. Generally, the class is limited to 25 coaches. Seating in the Camp Freightliner class is at a premium and always fills up with event attendees. We reserve those seats for members who attend the event. Camp Freightliner is also available as an online class. You can check the FCCCRV.com website for schedules and details.

Camp Freightliner will provide you with the information concerning your chassis about what service is required, why it is required and when it is required. It will also inform you of the operation of the systems, controls, what the various dash lights mean, how to operate safely, how to deal with emergency conditions that occur while driving and how to get help to deal with them. The information provided is specific to your chassis. I highly recommend it. I have attended it for each of the coaches I have owned.

Many members wish to take the class so they can learn to service their chassis. This is not the purpose of the class. The instructor will tell you the same thing. I was an aircraft mechanic nearly all my life. I work on a lot of things with my coach. I do not service my chassis. Few of us have the proper equipment or workshop to safely work on our chassis. A set of twenty-six ton jack stands, containers that will hold gallons of fluids and the place to properly dispose of them, just to name a few. I pay a professional to do it. They have access to the latest information and changes my chassis requires to continue to operate safely for many years and many miles.

Many think our events have no value to educate or inform on the many aspects of care, safe operation and enjoyment of their coach. As a result, we get a lot of requests to attend the Camp Freightliner without attending the associated event. Typically, our presenters include personnel from Allison Transmissions, Cummins engines, Michelin Tires, Onan (Cummins) generators, as well as FCCC and others. Often you can get your coach weighed and find out why it needs to be. The event is not just about sitting around playing bingo.

I believe the primary purpose of having a motorhome is for enjoyment. Learning about your coach, meeting other like minded RVers, a relaxing atmosphere and good entertainment seems like the definition of enjoyment to me.

Lastly, we are a non-profit organization. We are not in the business of making money from our events. We strive to provide quality educational seminars, great camaraderie with fellow RVers, fun entertainment and to break even, if we can. That means a certain minimum number of attendees are required to make that happen. So please, do not get angry when the event host says it is a requirement to attend the event if you want to attend the Camp Freightliner associated with it. There are other alternatives if you don't want to come and enjoy time with us.

We have several events planned for this year. We are working on the schedule for 2025. We will post it as soon as we have firm commitments. Check elsewhere in this issue or on the website at fcocrv.org for details. I'm sure you will find one that will fit into your schedule. If so, I'll see you there.





#### SLOW COOKER LEMON GARLIC CHICKEN WITH SPRING VEGETABLES

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 1 lemon, juiced and zested
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 teaspoon dried rosemary
- Salt and pepper to taste

- 1 bunch asparagus, trimmed and cut into bite-sized pieces
- 1 cup fresh or frozen peas
- 1 cup cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley (for garnish)
- Optional: 2 tablespoons cornstarch + 2 tablespoons water (for thickening)

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

- 1. Season chicken breasts with salt, pepper, dried thyme, and dried rosemary. Place them in the bottom of the slow cooker.
- 2. In a small bowl, mix together lemon juice, lemon zest, minced garlic and chicken broth. Pour this mixture over the chicken in the slow cooker.
- 3. Cover and cook on low for 4-6 hours or on high for 2-3 hours, or until the chicken is cooked through and tender. About 30 minutes before the chicken is done, add the trimmed asparagus, peas, and cherry tomatoes to the slow cooker. Stir gently to combine.
- 4. If you prefer a thicker sauce, mix cornstarch with water in a small bowl until dissolved. Stir this mixture into the slow cooker during the last 15-20 minutes of cooking. Stir well to combine and allow the sauce to thicken.
- Serve the chicken and vegetables together, spooning some of the sauce over the top. Garnish with chopped fresh parsley for added freshness and color

#### CONVECTION MICROWAVE BROWNIES

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1/2 cup (1 stick) unsalted butter
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/3 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon baking powder
- Optional: 1/2 cup chocolate chips or chopped nuts

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

- 1. Grease a microwave-safe baking dish or line it with parchment paper.
- 2. Melt butter in a microwave-safe bowl, melt the butter in the convection microwave in short bursts, stirring in between until completely melted. Once the butter is melted, stir in the sugar until well combined. Then, add the eggs and vanilla extract. Mix until smooth.
- 3. Sift in the cocoa powder, all-purpose flour, salt, and baking powder into the wet ingredients. Mix until just combined. Be careful not to overmix. If you're using chocolate chips or nuts, fold them into the batter at this point.
- 4. Pour the batter into the prepared baking dish, spreading it out evenly. Preheat your convection microwave to 350°F (175°C).
- 5. Place the baking dish in the convection microwave and bake for about 15-20 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out with a few moist crumbs attached.
- 6. Once baked, allow the brownies to cool in the dish for a few minutes before slicing and serving. You can enjoy them warm or at room temperature. Enjoy your delicious homemade brownies made right in your convection microwave!




