

FCOC Business Meeting Minutes from June 24, 2025 (Allegan, MI)

Treasurer's Report: Given by treasurer Tom Bernardi. The 2024 tax return has been filed; however, the 2017 return remains unresolved with the IRS. Club membership has declined from 5,000 to 4,000 members. The club recorded its first equity loss in four years, due in part to FCCC cutting back sponsorship. FCCC is no longer contributing \$50 per coach attending FCOC events. Additionally, postage, publication, administrative, and event-related costs have increased.

In 2024, member dues were raised from \$15 to \$25, which helped offset rising expenses. Despite these challenges, the club remains in good financial standing. Financial statements were made available for review during the meeting.

President Bertling added that the VP Business Development position remains open and encouraged members interested in the role to reach out.

Standing Rule Change: Tom Bernardi presented a proposed amendment to the Standing Rules regarding presidential spending authority. The new language is as follows: Authorized to expend available treasury funds for Club day-to-day operational needs such as conducting events, publishing newsletters, and other expenses that can be considered required to maintain Club functions. However, the President is only authorized to expend treasury funds for non-recurring operational expenditures or replacement of Club assets over \$1,000.00 after Executive Board majority approval. Additionally, no expenditures recommended by the Executive Board, listed in the Club minutes, will be made without prior approval of the Club President.

Lifetime Membership Recognition: Jan Bertling made a motion from the floor to grant a Lifetime Membership to Roy Hopper in recognition of his many years of service to FCOC.

Hello Fellow FCOC Members,

Right now, there is little direct support available to them. We have the knowledge, the resources, and the spirit to welcome them into our family.

I've spoken with folks at the Gaffney factory, and they have no objection to including all Freightliner chassis owners in our club. To make this happen, we would need to amend our bylaws so that membership is not limited by where a chassis was manufactured. Doing so would clear up the confusion, expand our community, and strengthen FCOC as the premier club for all RVers with a Freightliner chassis.

This is an important step, and I invite you to bring your thoughts, concerns, and ideas to our annual business meeting in Amana, IA, in June 2026. Together, we can ensure our club continues to grow, thrive, and welcome all who share our love of the open road.

Thank you for being part of this wonderful community. I look forward to seeing many of you down the road and at upcoming events.

TRAVELING IN STYLE: SCOTT AND KATHY LANG'S JOURNEY WITH THEIR WINNEBAGO TOUR

Scott and Kathy Lang are no strangers to the road. With over three decades of RV experience under their belts, the couple continues to live out their passion for adventure and togetherness in their 2011 Winnebago Tour 42QD. Their story is one of intentional living, spontaneous getaways, and making space both literally and figuratively for the people and things that matter most.

FAMILY ROOTS, RV ROUTES

For Scott and Kathy, RVing is in their DNA. Both come from RVing families, and it was natural to pass those traditions down to their children. "Our kids grew up in an RV park in Michigan," Kathy recalls, fondly noting that those early memories shaped not only family bonds but lifelong friendships. "Even today, they still keep in touch with the same kids from those summers."

Those trips weren't just fun. They were foundational. When asked about their favorite vacations, the Langs' children named Washington, DC. "We RVed there," Scott said with a smile. The answer reinforced for them how impactful RV travel had been in creating lasting family memories.

EVOLVING RIGS, UNCHANGING VALUES

Over 35 years, the Langs have tried nearly every RV type: trailers, fifth wheels, Class C, Class A, gas, diesel. Each served a stage in their life, but their current setup, a 42-foot diesel pusher, offers the space, comfort, and capability they now enjoy in retirement.

"We were actually looking for something smaller," Scott laughs. "Then we saw this one, and Kathy said, 'It's mine. I want it.'" The 2011 Winnebago Tour was bigger than they planned, but checked all the boxes: a full wall slide, fireplace, separate washer and dryer, ample storage, and even two bathrooms. A feature they now call surprisingly essential.

SPONTANEITY WITH A PLAN

Though RVing offers flexibility, Scott admits that owning a 42-foot motorhome requires more planning than he originally imagined. "I thought I could just hit the road," he says, "but these days, you need reservations."

Still, the Langs embrace spontaneity when they can. With everything packed and ready, it takes little more than loading clothes and food to hit the road. Whether it's a weeklong escape up north or a weekend boondocking at a dirt track, they make room for impromptu adventures. "We go from luxury resorts to open fields with pup tents," Scott says. "And everyone is having fun."

HOME, WHEREVER THEY ARE

Kathy prefers her motorhome to a hotel. Her bed, her food, her cleanliness. "I like it clean," she says. "And it's mine." They note the health and dietary benefits, too. They cook their own meals, stick to their routines, and avoid the pitfalls of travel that can derail good habits.

For Scott, driving is both a responsibility and a joy. "The first hour is stressful. Gauges, noises, tires. But then, it becomes my happy place." Meanwhile, Kathy settles in with her coffee and a book, enjoying the landscape from her recliner.

"It's not a vacation," she jokes. "It's a lifestyle."

COMMUNITY ON THE ROAD

Unlike hotel stays or airline travel, RVing opens the door to meaningful interactions. "You don't really meet people in hotel hallways," Kathy says. "But here, you talk. You share. You learn."

They find joy in chatting with other RVers about vehicles, routes, gadgets, and life. It's a reminder that even when parked in a different spot each night, they are part of a shared, mobile community.

MAKING IT WORK FOR FAMILY

Though their motorhome is tailored for two, it accommodates family visits easily. When their kids come to Florida this winter, they will have their own space, complete with a private bathroom and a queen mattress. "It's just comfortable enough that nobody stays too long," Kathy laughs.

LOOKING FORWARD

This past year, the Langs spent roughly 80 nights in their RV. A number they expect will grow. Snowbirding is next on the list, and while Kathy feels the pull of home, family, and church, she also supports Scott's lifelong dream of RV retirement.

"Eventually, we may not be able to drive it," Scott says. "But that is way down the road."

Until then, they plan to continue exploring, hiking, finding small town gems, and connecting with fellow travelers. Whether it's a quick detour to a historic site or a long stay in a scenic park, for Scott and Kathy Lang, RV life offers the perfect balance of freedom, comfort, and connection.

- Check batteries and tires. Test battery capacity and top off with distilled water. Verify your tires can handle early frost–consider upgrading to mud-and-snow ratings.
- Bring alternative heat. Portable propane heaters, hand warmers, or warm water bottles can boost comfort without overtaxing power systems.





MUST-PACK ESSENTIALS FOR FALL COMFORT

Don't overlook these practical items:

- Layered clothing: base layers, fleece, rain jacket, and thermal pajamas
- Warm bedding: flannel sheets, extra blankets, or down duvets

SPIKED CROCKPOT APPLE CIDER

Servings: 25 8-ounce glasses

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 gallon of apple cider
- 2 cinnamon sticks
- 4-star anise
- 1 tbsp. + 1 tsp. whole cloves
- 2 oranges, sliced plus more for garnish
- 2 lemons, sliced plus more for garnish
- 1 liter of good whiskey or bourbon



DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Add apple cider, cinnamon sticks, star anise, whole cloves, oranges, and lemons to the crockpot. Turn the heat on low and cook for 6-7 hours. Bonus: this will make the whole room smell delicious!
- **2.** Take out all of the whole spices, oranges, and lemons before serving. Pour in bourbon. Stir and serve. Garnish with sliced orange and lemon.

- 1-2 cups chicken broth
- 1 bell pepper, diced
- 2 tablespoons chili powder
- 1/2 tablespoon kosher salt
- 2 teaspoons cumin
- 2 teaspoons dried oregano
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper or red chili flakes


OPTIONAL TOPPINGS:


- Avocado

- 1. Heat oil in a Dutch oven. Sauté the onion, garlic, and jalapeno if using until fragrant, about 5 minutes.
- Add ground meat and break it up with a meat masher or wooden spoon. Cook until it's browned and just cooked through.
- Add remaining ingredients. Stir to combine.
- Cover with a lid and let it simmer. Just turn the heat to low and cover for 30 min to 2-3 hours.
- 5. Serve with desired toppings.

ONLINE MEMBERSHIP UPDATE OR RENEWAL

- 6. Complete your payment information and follow instructions to submit.

TO PAY DUES:

- 1. Sign in using the "Membership Log In" fields on the home page or the "Sign In" link in the top right corner of any page on the site.
- 2. Once you've signed in, select "Renew / Pay Dues" in the upper right corner of your screen.
